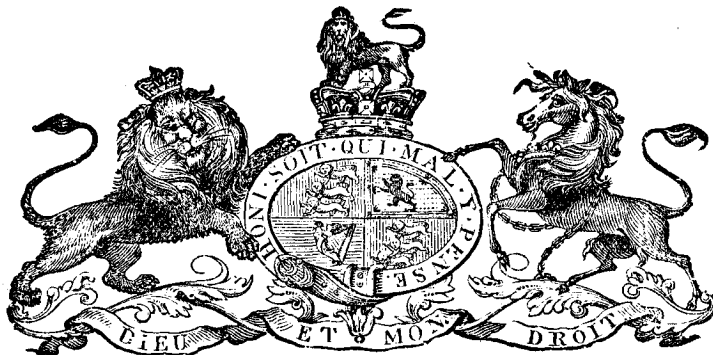

Appointing time for payment of Road Rates.
