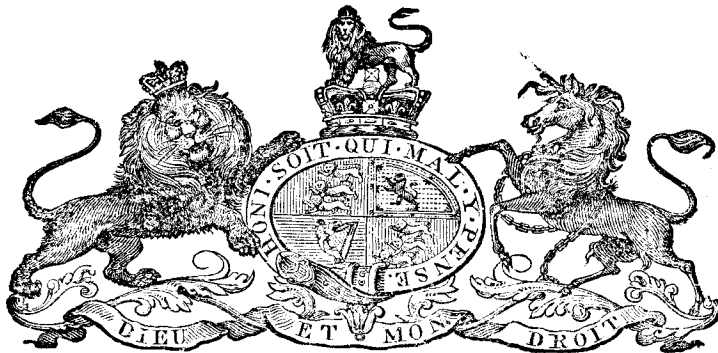

To make this return generally understood, the following notes are added :—

1. Extract from Minutes of Council, 24th April, 1866—Resolved, "That all schools opened in situations approved of by the Superintendent shall be entitled to Government aid to an amount of 15s per annum in respect of every pupil between the ages of five and ten years who shall pay a school fee not exceeding 6s 6d per quarter, and of 20s per annum in respect of every pupil above the age of ten years who shall pay a school fee not exceeding 10s per quarter, and in each instance be admitted to such schools as hereafter stated."

2. Minutes of Board, 2nd April, 1869— "That any school should receive the Government assistance, provided the parents of the children were entitled to Government aid and wished to send their children to any particular school."
