## RESERVE FOR A SITE FOR A CEMETERY.

WHEREAS by the Regulations for the sale and disposal of lands taken under the authority of "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," and "The New Zealand Settlements Amendment and Continuance Act, 1865," contained in the Schedule to an Order in Council made and issued, bearing date the 11th day of May, 1871, it is provided that reserves for roads and all other public purposes whatever, and for education, and the sites for churches and chapels or other places of worship for different religious denominations, may be made by Government out of any confiscated lands, and that notices of all such reserves shall be published in the *New Zealand Gazette*: It is hereby notified, that the land specified in the Schedule hereunder written shall be reserved for the purposes therein mentioned and set opposite the description of the said parcel of land.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington,  
this eighteenth day of February, 1874.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Native Land Act, 1873," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to divide the Colony into districts for the purposes set forth in the said Act, and the limits of such districts from time to time to alter as occasion may require:

Now therefore, I, Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, and in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said in part recited Act, do hereby order and declare that the Colony shall be divided into districts for the purposes of the said Act, as such are respectively defined in the Schedule hereunder written.

## SCHEDULE.

## TARANAKI.

This district comprises all that portion of the Province of Taranaki which lies to the southward of a right line drawn from Paranihinihi to the south-western corner of the Bay of Plenty District.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Licensing Act, 1873," it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor shall, as soon as conveniently may be after the passing of the said Act, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, define such territorial divisions as he may think proper to be Licensing Districts for the purposes of the said Act, and from time to time may alter and re-define the boundaries of the same: And whereas it is also further enacted by the said Act, that in the Proclamation declaring the said several districts the Governor shall in each case declare the number of persons of whom the Licensing Court of such district shall consist, such number not being more than seven nor less than three:

Now therefore, I, Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the provisions of the hereinbefore cited Act, do hereby proclaim, constitute, and appoint that the several territorial divisions, the boundaries whereof are defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto, shall be Licensing Districts for the purposes of the said Act; also that each such district shall be known by the name by which it is designated in the said Schedule: And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the Licensing Court of each one of the districts hereby proclaimed, constituted, and appointed, shall consist of four Commissioners, inclusive of the Resident Magistrate, who shall at any time hereinafter be appointed by me, the Governor aforesaid, to carry into effect the provisions of the said Act within such district.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Right Honorable Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at Wellington, this twenty-third day of February, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four.

PROVINCE OF TARANAKI.

---

PATEA DISTRICT.

Bounded on the East from the mouth of the River Patea by the boundary line between the Provinces of Taranaki and Wellington; on the North-east by a straight line bearing on the summit of Mount Egmont drawn from Parakino on the Wanganui River to the point where the said line is intersected by the Kairoa

\* For places beyond the limits of any of the districts herein defined, applications are to be made to the nearest Resident Magistrate or Licensing Court respectively.

and Waimate Road; and from that point of intersection, on the West by the said Kairoa and Waimate Road and the Waimate Stream to the sea; and on the South by the sea from the Waimate Stream to the mouth of the Patea River.

EGMONT DISTRICT.

Bounded on the East by the Patea District from the mouth of the Waimate Stream to the intersection of the Kairoa and Waimate Road by the straight line drawn from Parakino on the Wanganui River bearing on the summit of Mount Egmont; on the North-east from the said point of intersection by the last-named straight line to the said summit of Mount Egmont; on the East by a straight line drawn from the said summit of Mount Egmont to the southern angle of the Grey Block; on the North-east by the south-western boundary of the said block to the sea; and on the West and South-west by the sea.

WAIONGONA DISTRICT.

Bounded on the East and North-east by a straight line drawn from the summit of Mount Egmont to the source of the Waiongona River, and by that river to the sea; on the North-west by the sea; on the South-west and West by the north-east and eastern boundary of the Egmont District from the extreme west point of the Grey Block to the summit of Mount Egmont.

TOWN OF NEW PLYMOUTH DISTRICT.

Comprising the Town of New Plymouth and Town Belt as laid out by the New Zealand Company.

WAITARA DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North-west and West by the sea from the mouth of the Waiongona River to the tunnel at Parimihiri; and thence by a straight line in a direction due east (true bearing) for a distance of twenty miles; on the South-east by a straight line drawn from the eastern extremity of the said northern boundary in a direction south 39° west (true bearing) till it intersects the straight line between the summit of Mount Egmont and Parakino on the Wanganui River; on the South by the said last-named straight line from its intersection with the said south-eastern boundary to the summit of Mount Egmont; and thence on the West and South-west by the east and north-eastern boundaries of the Waiongona District, from the summit of Mount Egmont to the source of the Waiongona River; and by the said river to the sea.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At Wellington, this second day of February, 1874.

Present :

THE HONORABLE THE PREMIER  
PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intituled "The Supreme Court Act, 1860," it is provided that there shall be held Circuit Courts for the despatch of civil and criminal business of the Court, before one of the Judges thereof, at such places and times as the Governor in Council may from time to time appoint :

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, doth hereby fix and appoint that Circuit Courts for the despatch of civil and criminal business of the Supreme Court shall be held in the Resident Magistrate's Court House at New Plymouth, in the Province of Taranaki, in the Northern Judicial District of the Colony, on the first Monday in each of the months of April and October in each and every year, or so soon after as may be convenient : Provided that if and whenever any of the days hereby appointed for holding a Cir-

cuit Court shall happen to be a holiday of the Supreme Court, then the Circuit Court appointed to be holden on such day shall be holden on the first day thereafter not being such holiday.
