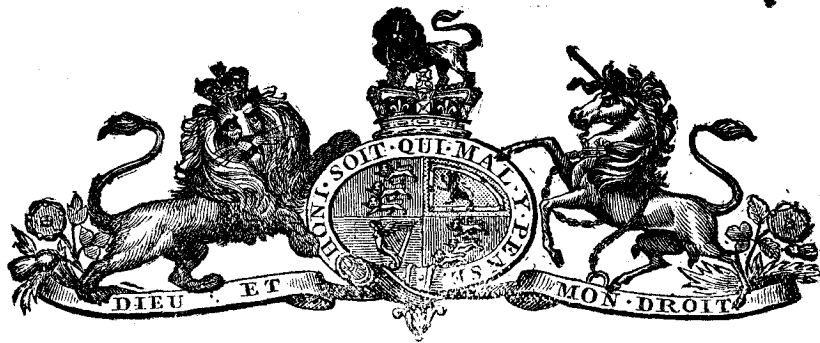

NOTICE TO CARTERS.

THE following clauses of the "Municipal Police Ordinance, 1862," are published for general information; and persons are cautioned that a penalty of not less than Five Shillings, nor exceeding Two Pounds, will be inflicted for the following offences:—

Every driver of a vehicle not driven by means of reins, who shall ride thereupon, there being no person on foot to guide, the same, or who shall wilfully remain at such a distance from his vehicle, whilst in motion, as not to have command of the Horses or Cattle drawing the same.

Every person who shall throw any glass, china, or earthenware upon a public thoroughfare, or hoops.
