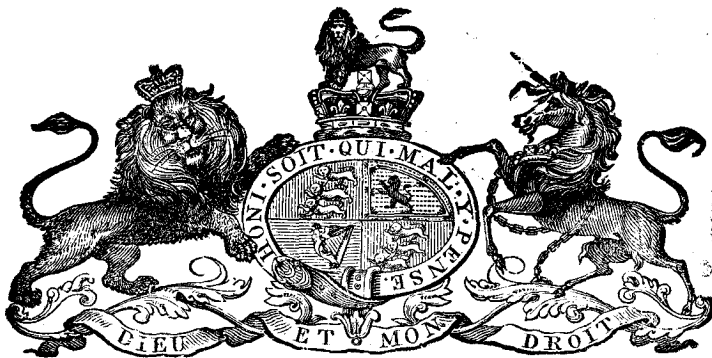

THE following letter from the
Surgeon to the Board of Health,
is published for general information.

New Plymouth, 22nd March, 1875.

SIR,—I have the privilege of report-
ing to your Honor upon the general
sanitary condition of New Plymouth
during the past year.

Two meetings of the Board of Health
have been held during the year; one
in the month of March, 1874, and the
last during the present month.

I have made inspections at different
times of suspected neighborhoods in
the town, and the dangers which
were not removed at my own repre-
sentations and remonstrances, were
laid before the Board on one or other
of the meetings referred to, and have
been promptly remedied, as far as at
present practicable. On the whole,
the year has been a very healthy one.
We have had no contagious epidemics.
The amount of illness and deaths has
been greater during the last two
months, but not more so than might
reasonably be expected in an unusually
hot and dry season.

The prevalent complaints since the
hot weather set in, have been dysentery,
diarrhoea, and stomach and bilious
fevers, children being the most gene-
rally affected. The deaths, I consider,
have been few, compared with the
numbers attacked. In no instance has
the sickness been traceable to any local
condition, the disease occurring alike
in the most airy and healthy localities,
and in the most crowded parts of the
town.

These most prevalent complaints,
since the hot weather set in, may
reasonably be attributed to the exces-
sive action of the skin, and the morbid
sympathy of the liver, and the conse-
quent acrid biliary secretions, and
febrile and irritable condition of the
lining mucous membrane of the stomach
and bowels, hence the bilious fever,
dysentery, diarrhoea, and gastro en-
teritis, all links in the same chain of
morbid symptoms.

The Board of Health has no power
to enforce habits of personal cleanliness,
so important in the preservation of
health, and the prevention of contagion,
as clean premises; but the Board

would act wisely in insisting on the establishment of free *baths* and wash-houses for such has have not the necessary convenience at home.—I have, &c.,
