PROCLAMATION.

BY His Honor ISAAC EARL FEATHERSTON, ESQUIRE, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, in the Islands of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation issued under the Seal of the Province of Wellington, and in Hand of me the said ISAAC EARL FEATHERSTON, on the Twenty-first day of November, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, the Wai-nui-o-mata District was declared to be a district within which rates upon land should be levied for the making, repair, maintenance, and improvement of the Highways therein, and the Western Boundary of the District was declared to be from Pencarrow Head along the Harbor of Port Nicholson to the mouth of the Waiwetu River; thence along the Eastern Bank of the Waiwetu River to the point where the Wai-nui-o-mata Road strikes the said Bank, thence along the Northern Boundary of Section No. 14. AND WHEREAS it is expedient to alter such Boundary—Now therefore I, ISAAC EARL FEATHERSTON, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, in virtue of the

Powers and Authority vested in me in this behalf, Do hereby Proclaim and declare that the Western Boundary of the Wai-nui-o-mata District shall henceforth be as follows—viz., from Pencarrow Head along the Harbor of Port Nicholson to the Mouth of the Waiwetu River, thence along the Western Bank of the Waiwetu River, and including so much of section number (13) thirteen Hutt District, as is required for making and maintaining the approach to the Bridge over the said River to the point where the line of the original Wai-nui-o-mata Road strikes the said Bank, thence along the Northern Boundary of section, No. (14) fourteen there.

GIVEN under my hand and Issued under the Public Seal of the Province of Wellington, at Wellington, this fifteenth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven.
