**W**HEREAS in the Fourth Session of the Provincial Council held in the Twentieth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, an Act was passed intituled "An Act to alter the Electoral District of the Wairarapa and Hawks Bay:" AND WHEREAS the said Act was presented to me for the assent of His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand on the Twentieth day of February last, and was then reserved by me for His Excellency's assent or disallowance: AND WHEREAS His Excellency has been pleased to assent to the said Act—Now therefore I, the said ISAAC
