PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor ISAAC, EARL FEATHERSTON, ESQUIRE, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, in the Islands of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by the "Public Boards Act, 1856," of the Provincial Council of Wellington, It was enacted that the Superintendent might whenever he should deem fit by Proclamation declare that a Board of Wardens for the management of Local Public Works and matters should be established for any Shire, District, Township, Town, or Ward and might unite and declare any District, Townships, Towns or Wards to be a District for the purposes of the said Act. And Whereas it is deemed fit to establish a Public Board for the District of Waipukarau.

NOW THEREFORE I, ISAAC EARL FEATHERSTON, the Superintendent of the Province of Wellington under the power vested in me by the Act above referred to, do hereby Proclaim, that a Board of Wardens for the management of Local Public Works and matters shall be es-

tablished for the District of Waipukarau, the boundaries of which District for the purposes of the said Act, I declare to be as follows, viz:—

- North.—By a line due east and west passing through the Trigonometrical Station at Kawehi, near Te Aute.
- South.—By the Porangahau and Mangawhero rivers to Rae Katia, a remarkable hill, thence due west to the Ruahine Mountains.
- East.—By the sea from the River Porangahau to three miles north of the river Manawarokau.
- West.—By the Ruahine mountains.

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the Province of Wellington, at Wellington, this sixth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor ISAAC EARL FEATHERSTON, ESQUIRE, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, in the Islands of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by the Land Regulations now in force in the Province of Wellington, it is declared that all Reserves for the sites of Townships or Suburban Lands, for the sites of Agricultural and Small Farm Settlements or for any other purpose of public advantage, safety, convenience, health or enjoyment shall be determined by the Superintendent who shall notify the same by Proclamation wherein the object shall be specified for which any reserve shall be made. And whereas it would be of public advantage if certain Blocks of Land in the vicinity of Public Works in progress were set apart for the location and use of Immigrants employed on such works. Now therefore I, ISAAC EARL FEATHERSTON, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, in virtue of the power and authority vested in me in this behalf do hereby Proclaim and declare that a certain Block of Land containing about 1200 acres, situate near Greytown in the Wairarapa Valley, bounded on the Western side by the line of road through the Three Mile Bush. On the Northern side by a line at right angles to the above along the Southern boundary of section No. 142 and extending Eastward

about eighty-one chains. On the Eastward by a line nearly parallel to the Three Mile Bush line of road, and about eighty one chains distant therefrom; and on the Southward by a line Westward eighty-one chains from the last line to the Three Mile Bush line is hereby reserved and set apart by me for the purpose aforesaid,
