Wellington, 16th June, 1858.

SIR,

I have the honor to inform you that the Executive Council have resolved that no further monies be stopped from the wages of Immigrants introduced by the Provincial Government, on account of their Promissory Notes, excepting in cases where one moiety or the whole has already fallen due and remains unpaid, or where the debtor wishes to leave the Province.

And it has been resolved that you take every opportunity that may occur for making this change known to the Immigrants whom it may concern.
