PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor ISAAC EARL FEATHERSTON, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, in the Islands of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by an Act of the First Session of the Provincial Council of Wellington, intituled "An Act to make further provisions relative to Fencing within the Districts of the Province," it was enacted that the Superintendent should, whenever it should appear to him expedient, declare by "Proclamation" that the said Act should come into operation within any Town or District of the Province, and by the same Proclamation declare the limits of such Town or District:

Now, therefore, I, ISAAC EARL FEATHERSTON, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, do hereby proclaim and declare that the above-mentioned Act shall come into operation within such part of the Ahuriri District as is comprised within the following boundaries, viz.—North, Ahuriri Harbour;

South and East, River Meanee; West, Puketapu Road.

A line commencing at the Umataro, thence to te Pou a Oenuku, thence to te Inawhiti, thence to te Whare o Toriaia, where it enters the Taumabapu Wood, and passing through the Wood, emerges at te Whataupoko, thence to te Upoko o pana, where it enters the Mangamate, thence up the Mangamate to Manga-taiorea, thence to Taumata o Matakite, thence to the Mangaonuku, thence down the Mangaonuku to Parikarangaranga, thence to te Manga-a-Rangipeke, thence to te Whakarapurapu, thence to the Umataro, where it ends.
