PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor ISAAC EARL FEATHERSTON, ESQUIRE, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington in the Islands of New Zealand.

I, ISAAC EARL FEATHERSTON, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, in pursuance of the Regulations in this behalf *Do hereby proclaim and notify*, that the several Sections of Land in the Warehama Block, in the East Coast District of the Province of Wellington, specified in the Schedule hereto (except such as may be reserved under the provision hereafter mentioned) will be put up for sale by Public Auction, at the Crown Lands Office, in the Town of Wellington, on Wednesday, the thirteenth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, *at one o'clock P.M.*

If at any time during the sale it may appear to the Commissioner of Crown Lands beneficial or expedient for the public service to reserve from sale any of the sections specified in the said Schedule, or vary the order in which they are to be put up, he is hereby authorised to do so.

To KENNETH MUIRHEAD, of Otago in the Province of Otago, in the Southern District of New Zealand, Master Mariner, Master of the Barque or Vessel called the "ACASTA," now lying at Otago aforesaid, and William McVicar, of Wellington, in the Province of Wellington and Colony of New Zealand, Master Mariner, Greeting:

Whereas an action has been commenced in the Supreme Court of New Zealand, for the Middle District at Wellington, wherein James Smith is Plaintiff and John Brodie and George Traill are Defendants: And whereas it hath been made known to us that there is personal property belonging

to the said John Brodie and George Traill, now in the hands or in the Custody or under the control of you the said Kenneth Muirhead and William McVicar or one of you: We command you and each of you that you and each of you do not sell or otherwise dispose of or part with the said personal property of the said John Brodie and George Traill or any part thereof until the further order of our said Court shall be made known to you.
