To JAMES WILLIE SEDCOLE, of Wellington, in the Province of Wellington, and Colony of New Zealand, Master Mariner, Master of the Ship or Vessel called the "THAMES CITY," now lying at anchor in the Port of Wellington aforesaid, Greeting:

Whereas an action has been commenced in the Supreme Court of New Zealand, for the Middle District at Wellington, aforesaid, wherein George Crawford is Plaintiff and Henry Rounthwaite is Defendant: And whereas it has been made known to us that there is personal property belonging to the said Henry Rounthwaite, now in the hands or in the Custody or under the control of you the said James Willie Sedcole: We command you that you do not sell or otherwise dispose of or part with the said personal property of the said Henry Rounthwaite, or any part thereof until the further order of our said Court shall be made known to you.
