WILLIAM FOX.

Downing-street, 2nd Feb., 1862.

SIR,—I have to acknowledge the receipt of  
your despatch of the 20th October, "Separate,"  
with the accompanying documents, in which  
you report the dismissal of Major Cooper and  
Mr. Broughton, from Her Majesty's Service.

The conduct of Major Cooper, in his seduc-  
tion of a young native girl, and in his subse-  
quent attempts to regain possession of her is so  
flagrant, and the importance of checking such  
scandals on the part of the colonists in authority  
is so great, that—although I am generally much  
averse to re-opening charges which have been  
once disposed of—I find it impossible to arrive  
at any other conclusion than that both Major  
Cooper himself, and Mr. Broughton who assisted  
him in this matter, were properly dismissed from  
Her Majesty's Service.
