## *Extended Jurisdiction, R. M. Courts.*

### A PROCLAMATION

*Extending Jurisdiction of the Resident Magistrates' Courts at Wellington, Wanganui, and Nelson.*

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the "Resident Magistrates' Jurisdiction Extension Act, 1862," it is enacted that every case of a claim for debt or damages such as might at the passing of the said Act be lawfully tried in a Resident Magistrate's Court, where the debt or damages claimed do not exceed Twenty Pounds, may be tried in any Resident Magistrate's Court, with respect to which this Act shall be in operation, when the debt or damages claimed do not exceed Fifty Pounds:

And it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the Colony declare that the limit of jurisdiction of any such Court shall be extended to One Hundred Pounds and such limit of jurisdiction shall be in such case extended accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the said recited Act and of an Order in Council dated the 17th day of December, 1862, authorising the issue of Proclamations under the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the provisions of the said recited Act and especially the powers conferred by sections two and three thereof, shall be exercised to the limit of Jurisdiction of One hundred Pounds in the Resident Magistrates' Courts at Wellington, Wanganui, and Nelson; and I do further proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and from the first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three.

Given under my hand at the Government House, at Auckland, and issued under the seal of the Colony of New Zealand, this twenty-first day of January, in the year of our Lord, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three.

## SALE OF VALUABLE FREHOLD LAND IN THE TOWN OF WELLINGTON, NEW ZEALAND.

UNDER authority of an Act, Session III, No. 14, of the Provincial Council of Wellington entitled "Harbor Reserves," and of an Act, Session VIII, No. 3, of the said Provincial Council, entitled "Harbor Reserves Amendment,"—Notice is hereby given that the following Allotments of Land, situated in the Town of Wellington, will be offered for sale at Public Auction, at the Office of the Provincial Treasury, at Wellington, on WEDNESDAY, the 25th day of February, 1863, at One o'clock, p.m., at the upset prices affixed in the sub-joined Schedule.

Immediate payment in cash of one-tenth of the purchase money shall be the condition of any such sale by auction, and the remaining nine-tenths of the purchase-money must be paid by the purchaser within one calendar month next after the time of such sale by auction, or the one-tenth of the purchase money which has been deposited will be forfeited, and the original contract for the sale of the land will thenceforward be null and void.

The Government reserves to itself the right of, at any time, withdrawing and altering the size of any of the allotments.

Sir,

I am instructed by Mr. Domett to call your attention to the Returns inserted in the "New Zealand Gazette," describing the persons of Deserters from Her Majesty's Army and Navy.

It is the earnest wish of the Government to check the practice of Desertion from the Imperial Forces: and hence a Reward of Five Pounds has been offered by the Colonial Government to the person capturing any such Deserters (in addition to the Reward of Two Pounds granted by the Imperial Government). And the publication of the Descriptive Returns above alluded to, will be from time to time continued.

The Government relies with confidence on your making use of every means in your power to carry out these efforts to check Desertion; and it is hoped that the means now provided for identifying the men will lead to the apprehension of all who are still at large.
