PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor ISAAC EARL FEATHERSTON, ESQUIRE, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, in the Islands of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Provincial Council, Session IX., No. 1, the Superintendent was authorised to erect a Toll Bar with House and other works necessary thereto, at some convenient place on the Kai-warra-warra Road, outside the town, and to fix by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* the day on and after which Tolls should be levied at such Toll Bar: And whereas in pursuance thereof a Toll Bar has been erected on the Kai-warra-warra Road: Now therefore I, Isaac Earl Featherston, Superintendent of the said Province of Wellington, Do hereby proclaim that Tolls shall be levied at the Toll Bar so erected, on and after the second day of March next.

Public Reserve in Carterton.

PROCLAMATION

By His Honor ISAAC EARL FEATHERSTON, ESQUIRE, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, in the Colony of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by the Land Regulations now in force in the Province of Wellington, it is declared that all Reserves for the sites of Townships or Suburban Lands, for the sites of Agricultural and Small Farm Settlements, or for any other purpose of public advantage, safety, convenience, health, or enjoyment, shall be determined by the Superintendent who shall notify the same by Proclamation, wherein the object shall be specified for which any Reserve shall be made: And whereas it would be of public advantage if certain lands in the Township of Carterton were set apart for the erection of public buildings thereon and for other public purposes: NOW THEREFORE, I, Isaac Earl Featherston, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, in virtue of the Power and Authority vested in me in this behalf, Do hereby proclaim and declare that Section Number Three (3), in the Township of Carterton, containing Ten (10) acres, more or less, and bounded on the North by Section No. Two (2), on the South by Section No. Four (4) on the East by Section No. Thirty (30), and on the West by the Public Road, is hereby reserved and set apart by me for the purposes aforesaid.
