UNDER AUTHORITY OF AN ACT, Session III., No. 14, of the Provincial Council of Wellington, entitled "Harbour Reserves," and of an Act, Session VIII., No. 3, of the said Provincial Council, entitled "Harbour Reserves Amendment,"—Notice is hereby given that the following Allotments of Land, situated in the Town of Wellington, will be offered for sale at Public Auction, at the Office of the Provincial Treasury, at Wellington, on **WEDNESDAY**, the 27th day of May, 1863, at 1 o'clock p. m., at the upset prices affixed in the subjoined Schedule, being lots that were sold on the 14th of April, 1858, but the purchase of which has not been completed.
