Wairarapa Militia District.

The Governor's Delegation to the Superintendent.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies and Vice Admiral of the same, &c.; &c.

WHEREAS it is provided by the Militia Acts Amendment Act, 1862, that it shall be lawful for the Governor or such person as he shall appoint as his Deputy for that purpose from time to time to call out the whole or any part or number of any Regiment, Battalion, Company or Company as he shall think fit.

And whereas it is expedient that a person should be appointed for the Militia District of Wairarapa to exercise the powers aforesaid. Now therefore I, Sir George Grey, the Governor as aforesaid, in pursuance and execution of the said recited Act do hereby appoint

ISAAC EARL FEATHERSTON, ESQ., to be my Deputy within the said District of Wairarapa from time to time to call out the Militia thereof for training and exercise subject nevertheless to the conditions and restrictions of the laws in force for the regulation of the Militia.

Regulations for Balloting.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies and Vice Admiral of the same, &c.; &c.

WHEREAS by the Militia Acts Amendment Act, 1865, it is provided that if at the close of any class be not required, the names to be drawn out shall be taken by ballot according to such rules as the Governor shall from time to time make for that purpose.

Fixing number of days for Training.

By His Excellency Sir George Grey, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS, it is provided by the "Militia Acts Amendment Act, 1862," that the number of days and hours for the meeting of the Militia for any District for training and exercise shall be from time to time fixed by the Governor.

AND WHEREAS, it is deemed expedient to fix the number of days and hours for training and exercise of the Militia of the Wanganui District.

I do hereby fix the number of days and hours during which that portion of the Militia of the Wanganui District which may be called out for training and exercise within Three months from the date hereof shall be trained and exercised at the rate of Fourteen days.

Constitution of the Wanganui District.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR, by Order.
WHEREAS by the "Militia Act, 1858," the Governor is empowered to constitute throughout the Colony or in any part thereof, Militia Districts, and to designate the Militia within the said Districts by the name of a Regiment, Battalion, Corps, or Company: And whereas in and by an Order in Council made on the 26th day of June, 1863, the Militia District of Wairarapa was constituted and defined:

Now, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order, designate the Militia within the said District by the name of a Regiment.

Regulations.

BY virtue of the authority of the authority vested in me by the "Militia Act, 1858," and the "Militia Amendment Act, 1862," I, Sir George Grey, K.C.B., the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby make the following Regulations for the Regulation of the Wairarapa Militia.

- 1. The Militia of the Wairarapa District shall not be called out as the Wairarapa Regiment shall constitute one Battalion.
- 2. Such Battalion shall be divided into three Classes.
