*Report of the Commissioners for the Management of the City Reserves.*

Wellington, Sept. 5, 1863.

To His Honor,  
The Superintendent.  
Sir,

The Commissioners for the Management of the City Reserves, for your Honor's information, beg to furnish the following report.

The Commissioners were appointed December 24, 1862; during a period of eight months they have been enabled to arrange for an accurate and complete survey of the Town Belt, comprising twelve hundred acres, which have been divided into sixty-five allotments, the greater part of which are let to thirty-one individuals for fourteen years, and yield an annual rent of £600 3s. 9d., as shown by the detailed schedule of Town Belt leases hereunto annexed.

The Commissioners have succeeded in letting the Botanical Garden Reserve to Mr. David Robertson, upon the following terms:—

The reserve to be fenced, planted with a quick hedge, and a belt of trees. To be given up at any time during the currency of the lease, paying for improvements at a valuation. The public to have access to the garden between certain hours during the week, according to regulations to be framed.

The Commissioners have reserved a most suitable block of Land containing about 143 acres, on the East side of the Canal and Basin Reserve, as a site for a Public Park; which it is to be hoped will be soon fenced in.

The Canal and Basin Reserve to the

extent of nearly twelve acres, has, by the valuable aid of the prison labour, been reclaimed from the state of an impassable swamp, to available and almost dry land. 24 chains of outlet drain, 6 feet wide, 4 feet deep, have been formed; about 64 chains of open and covered branch drains have been constructed; and a considerable portion of this ground has been sown with grass seed.

By means of a public subscription supplemented by an equal amount from the Government, the whole of the Basin Reserve, nearly 10 acres, has been fenced in, with a substantial four-railed fence, and planted with a thorn hedge. A foot path, eight feet wide, has been formed on the outside of it.

The Commissioners regret to state that the ground intended as a cricket ground will not be ready for use during the present summer. A portion of the Canal Reserve is being fenced in; a list of the Subscribers towards the fencing is appended, also a statement of expenditure connected with the Commission.

The Commissioners have to record their appreciation of the assistance rendered them by the authorities connected with the department of Crown Lands and that of the Survey.

The Commissioners beg to hand to your Honor the Leases and Counterparts (as per Schedule) signed by the Commissioners, for your Honor's signature, and they beg to notify that they now hand these over to your Honor to hold, on behalf of the Province, as collateral security for the advances of money already made or promised to be made from the Treasury to the Board of Commissioners amounting to four hundred and thirty pounds, five shillings and two pence, as per account enclosed. We further beg to hand to your Honor the minutes of our various meetings—twenty two in number—together with the Correspondence. Also, an authentic Map of the Town Belt as surveyed off into allotments—and mapped in accordance with the instructions of the City Commissioners by Mr. Hughes, and examined and found correct by Mr. Skeet, as by his letter dated September 2, 1863, which is forwarded, together with the minutes and other documents.

Gentlemen,

I have the honor to inform you that according to instructions received from Mr. Commissioner Lewis, and the Secretary for the Commissioners for the management of the City Reserves. I have checked the Survey of the Town Belt, made by Mr. J. Hughes and upon the whole found it correct. There however is a difference of Twenty-five links between Mr. Hughes Survey and that of Mr. Park, along the Adelaide Road and the Town acres at the South Western extremity of the Town, as shewn by the red lines on Mr. Hughes plan. The Crown Land Commissioner, has agreed

that Mr. Park's Survey shall remain intact and I have checked and altered the Leases accordingly. This discrepancy does not affect the correctness of Mr. Hughes work, as a correct survey.

I have also examined the map supplied by Mr. Hughes, and found the work laid down correctly.

I have also examined and initialed the plans on the leases.

*Notice to Mariners.*

Report made by Captain Gibson, S. Ship Auckland, of a rock said to exist near Napier, Hawke's Bay, New Zealand, not laid down in the Admiralty Charts. 11th August, 1863. 7.45 Weighed; 8, set on full speed and rounded Ahuriri Bluff; 8.20 a.m. ship heading S.E. by E. grazed a rock without stopping her headway, immediately stopped the engines, closed the valves in the water tight bulkheads, and sounded each compartment; Depth of Water alongside 9 fathoms; tide three quarters ebb; ship's draught forward 11 ft., aft 12 ft. 6 inches; Compass bearing taken immediately after striking North Eastern extreme of Ahuriri Bluff, West; Cape Kidnappers, S.E. having no deviation with the Ship heading S.E. by E. I can confidently state the bearings to be correct.

8.30 a.m. finding the ship making no water proceeded at half speed, hand lead kept constantly going, and pump wells sounded half hourly.

*Diseased Cattle Regulations.—  
Nelson.*

IN compliance with the request of His Honor the Superintendent of Nelson, the following proclamation, &c., under the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," is republished from the *Gazette* of that Province for general information.

## PROCLAMATION.

Under "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861."  
By His Honor JOHN PERRY ROBINSON, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Nelson, in the Islands of New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by a Proclamation dated the Twelfth day of December, 1861, I, John Perry Robinson, Superin-

tendent of Nelson, did declare and proclaim that the Colonies of Australia, that is to say, the Colony of Victoria, of New South Wales, of Queensland, of South Australia, and of Western Australia, as well as the Colony of Tasmania, and the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope, should be deemed to be for the purposes of the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," infected districts, and whereas it is expedient to remove the prohibition imposed by the said Proclamation, so far as regards the Colonies and places hereinafter named. Now therefore, I John Perry Robinson, by virtue of the powers vested in me by a Warrant of the Governor, issued under the provisions of the said Act, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation, in so far as the same as relates to the Colonies of South Australia and Tasmania, and the District of Twofold Bay in the Colony of New South Wales, and I do hereby declare that the said Colonies and District shall not from the date thereof, until further notice, be deemed infected Districts for the purposes of the said Act, and that subject to the regulations hereunto annexed and to any regulations that may from time to time be in force in that behalf, cattle may be imported into the Province of Nelson from the said Colonies and District.

The following Regulation is to be observed with respect to all cattle imported into the Province of Nelson, New Zealand, from the Colonies of South Australia and Tasmania, and the District of Twofold Bay, New South Wales.

Before any Cattle which shall have been shipped from any port or place in the Colonies of South Australia, or Tasmania, or in the District of Twofold Bay, in New South Wales, are inspected by any Inspector of Diseased Cattle for the Port or place in the Province of Nelson at which it is desired to land such Cattle, such Inspector shall require from the master of the vessel bringing such cattle a certificate from the Inspector of Cattle, or if there be no such Inspector, then from the Col-

lector of Customs, or if there be no Inspector or Collector of Customs, then from the Police Magistrate, or from two Justices of the Peace, at the Port or place where such Cattle were last shipped, to the effect that the District wherein such port or place is situated, was to the best of his or their knowledge and belief, free from infectious disease at the time of shipment, and that the Cattle shipped were clean and free from such disease. And in case the master of any such vessel shall have neglected to procure or be unable to produce such a certificate, the Inspector of Diseased Cattle for the Port or place where it is desired to land such Cattle, shall not proceed to inspect

the said cattle, nor grant a certificate of cleanness, nor a quarantine certificate, until such master shall have paid to the Provincial Treasurer a fee of Twenty pounds if the number of Cattle to be inspected shall not exceed twenty, or one pound per head if the number shall exceed twenty, nor until such master shall have made declaration in the usual statutory form of the cleanness of the said Cattle, and of the District from which they were last shipped.
