ORDER IN COUNCIL.

G. GREY,
At the Government House at Auckland,
the twenty-first day of October, 1863.

Present:
His EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN
COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled, the "Militia Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, to constitute throughout the Colony, or in any part thereof, Militia Districts; and such Districts, from time to time, to vary and to designate the Militia of any such Districts by the name of a Regiment, Battalion, Corps, or Company.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the above power doth, by this present order, constitute the following Militia District to be called and known

by the name following, viz.—

THE CASTLE POINT DISTRICT,
And doth define the said District to be all the Territory comprised within the circumference of a circle whereof the radius extends fifteen miles from Mr. Thomas Guthrie's house at Castle Point.

And doth designate the Militia of the said District a Regiment.

A Proclamation

For the Naturalisation of certain Persons

By **HIS EXCELLENCY SIR GEORGE GREY,** Knight, Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by "The Naturalization Act, 1862," it is enacted that every person who shall be declared to come within the operation of that Act by any Proclamation to be issued in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor, shall, as from the time in such Proclamation specified, be deemed and taken until the termination of the next session of the General Assembly, to be and to have

been from such specified time, a natural born subject of Her Majesty, within the Colony of New Zealand, as fully to all intents and purposes as if his name had been inserted in the Schedule to that Act annexed: Provided always, that every such Proclamation shall contain the description, occupation, or calling of every person therein named, and his place of residence at the date of such Proclamation.

Now, therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare, that the persons hereinafter mentioned, shall come within the operation of the said Act, from the date hereinafter specified, viz.:—
