a proposed National Shakespeare  
Memorial, is published for general infor-  
mation.

ALFRED DOMETT.

Sir,—We do ourselves the honor of  
calling your Excellency's attention to the  
accompanying Resolution of the Shakes-  
peare Committee,\* inviting your co-ope-  
ration in making known to her Majesty's  
subjects within your Province, the inten-  
tion to celebrate next year the three hun-  
dredth Birthday of Shakespeare, in a  
manner worthy of the poet and of the  
poet's countrymen.

It is felt by the Noblemen and Gentle-  
men composing the Shakespeare Commit-  
tee that all her Majesty's subjects who  
speak the language of Shakespeare must  
regard with interest the proposal to com-  
memorate his birth, by the erection of a  
monument in a conspicuous part of Lon-  
don. It may not be possible for many of  
those who reside in distant parts of the British  
dominions to assist personally on the  
23rd April, 1864, in laying the Foundation  
Stone of the proposed National Memorial.  
Nevertheless, as many thousands so cir-  
cumstanced must desire to contribute to-  
wards such an undertaking, it is hoped  
they may be afforded a suitable opportu-  
nity of doing so.

The Committee have therefore in-  
structed us to communicate with the repre-  
sentatives of the Crown in the various  
British Colonies, and to request their good  
offices in making the object of this appli-  
cation widely known.

The people of England have had so  
many recent and gratifying proofs of the  
strong sympathy which unites them to their  
Colonial brethren in all matters of national  
interest, that we anticipate a hearty and  
early response to this invitation on  
on the part of your Council and of the  
community the administration of whose  
affairs has been entrusted to your Excel-  
lency.

We feel that it would be presumptuous  
in us to offer any special suggestions as to  
the most effective mode of bringing the  
subject before the people of the Colony.  
The proper authorities there can alone  
fitly decide such local details. We may,  
however, state that it is confidently ex-  
pected that this movement will ere long  
be honoured by Her Majesty's immediate  
patronage, and by the Presidency of his  
Royal Highness the Prince of Wales.  
When the list of distinguished Vice-  
Presidents, Officers, and Members of the  
Committee is completed, we shall have  
much pleasure in transmitting it. We  
have further to request that your Ex-  
cellency will allow your name to be added  
to the list of the National Shakespeare  
Committee.

In the meantime, we may state that  
contributions towards the Shakespeare  
Memorial should be remitted to Messrs  
Coutts & Co., Bankers, London.

We shall also be most happy to pay  
every attention to any communication  
with which your Excellency may favour  
us on the subject of this letter,
