*Altering the boundary of the Turakina Valley Road District.*

PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor ISAAC EARL FEATHERSTON, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, in the Colony of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Provincial Council of the Province of Wellington, Session IX, No. 10, intituled "The District Highways Act 1862," it was enacted that the Superintendent might for the purpose of the said Act, from time to time by proclamation divide the Province or any part thereof into Districts, and in like manner sub-divide, alter, or reunite the same. AND WHEREAS by Proclamation dated on the seventh day of December, 1860, the Northern boundary of the Kahauraponga Road District is described as running in a straight line from the Northern boundary of Block LXXVII, in a S.W. direction to the N.E. corner of Section 42 in the Turakina District: AND WHEREAS by Proclamation dated the twenty-second day of June, 1863, the boundary of the Turakina Valley Road District is described as running in a North Easterly direction until it reaches the Omaha Stream at the Western corner of land belonging to one Mr. Bruce, and then running in an Easterly direction along the Omaha Stream until it reaches the boundary

between the Rangitiki and Turakina Districts, thence following the said boundary towards the North until it reaches the Ngaruranui Stream: AND WHEREAS it is desirable that the said boundary should be altered. Now, therefore, I, Isaac Earl Featherston, Superintendent of the said Province, in virtue of the power in me vested in that behalf, do hereby proclaim that the boundary of the said Turakina Valley Road District, instead of running in a North Easterly direction until it reaches the Omaha Stream as above recited, shall run along the Northern boundary of the Kahauraponga Road District as also above recited, until it intersects the line dividing the Rangitiki and the Turakina Districts, the Northern boundary of the Kahauraponga Road District remaining as described in the above mentioned proclamation dated the seventh day of December, 1860, as shown in the plan hereon delineated.

**A PROCLAMATION**

*For the Naturalization of certain Persons.*

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GRAY, Knight, Commander of the most honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by "The Naturalization Act, 1863," it is enacted that every person who shall be declared to come within the

operation of that Act by any Proclamation, to be issued in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor, shall, as from the time in such Proclamation specified, be deemed and taken, until the termination of the next Session of the General Assembly, to be, and to have been from such specified time a natural-born subject of Her Majesty within the Colony of New Zealand, as fully to all intents and purposes as if his name had been inserted in the Schedule to that Act annexed. Provided always that every such Proclamation shall contain the description, occupation, or calling of every person therein named, and his place of residence at the date of such Proclamation.

Now, therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the persons hereinafter mentioned shall come within the operation of the said Act from the dates hereinafter specified, viz.:

**T**HE following Light-house Rates for the Port of Wellington, as fixed by the Marine Board, are published for general information.

Lighthouse Rates fixed July 14th, 1863, under the Marine Board Act, 1862, for the Port of Wellington in New Zealand, are hereby revoked, and the following fixed in lieu thereof, in accordance with the power vested in the Marine Board, by the 21st Section of the Marine Board Act, 1863.

For all Vessels from Europe or any other port beyond the Australasian Colonies, per Register Ton 9d. (nine pence.)

All vessels from the Australian Colonies or Tasmania, per Register Ton, 6d. (six pence.)

For every Steam or Sailing Vessel, employed in the Coasting Trade, per Register Ton, 2d. (two pence.)

The above Dues shall be levied on entering inwards only, and payable on and after the date of the Marine Board Act, 1863, coming into force.
