THE following Notices issued by the Marine Board relative to the light to be exhibited on the Island of Tiri Tiri Matangi, and the Buoy in the Shearer's Rock, are published for general information.

READER WOOD,

Lighthouse, Tiri Tiri Matangi, Honrahi Gulf.

The Lighthouse in course of construction on the S.E. end of Tiri Tiri, in latitude $36^{\circ} 36' 30''$ S., longitude $174^{\circ} 55' 15''$ E., will be lit from sun set to sun rise, from and after 1st January, 1865.

The Tower is of iron, 48 feet high, painted light red color, and the focal plane of the lantern is 300 feet above high water mark.

The illuminating apparatus is Dioptric of the 2nd order, showing a fixed white light all round the horizon, which may be seen from the deck of a vessel in clear weather at a distance of 23½ nautical miles.

Buoy on Shearer's Rock.

Notice is also given that a red buoy has been laid in 14 fathoms N.N.E. of, and close to the Shearer's Rock, distant from the Lighthouse about one mile, with the following magnetic bearings:—Southern extreme of Tiri Tiri, S. 52° W.; Northern extreme of Tiri Tiri, S. 67° W.; Lighthouse Tower, S. 67° W.

Dog Island, Foveaux Straits, Lighthouse.

Dog Island Lighthouse is situated on a small island of that name in Foveaux Straits, off the entrance to the Bluff Harbour, in $43^{\circ} 39' 35''$ South latitude, and $168^{\circ} 28'$ East longitude, as measured on the Admiralty chart.

The light will show all round, and will be a Holophotal Dioptric Revolving White Light, of the first order, attaining its greatest brilliancy every half-minute.

It will be elevated about 150 feet above the level of the sea, and will be visible in clear weather about 29 nautical miles,

allowing fifteen feet for the height of the observer's eye, and at lesser distances according to the state of the atmosphere.

The Tower is built of native stone of a grey colour, and will be 118 feet in height from the ground to the top of the lantern.

This light is expected to be ready for permanent exhibition not later than April, 1865.

Mana Island, Cook's Straits, Lighthouse.

Mana Island Lighthouse is now in course of erection, on the North-western promontory of Mana Island, off the entrance to Porirua Harbour, on the Eastern shore of Cook's Straits, in $41^{\circ} 5'$ South latitude, and $174^{\circ} 48'$ East longitude, as measured on the Admiralty Chart.

The light will be a fixed Dioptric White Light of the second order, and will be seen in every direction where not intercepted by land.

The light will be elevated about 450 feet above the sea, and will be visible in clear weather about 29 nautical miles, allowing fifteen feet for the height of the observer's eye, and at lesser distances according to the state of the atmosphere.

The Tower will be seventy feet in height, from the base to the vane.

This light is expected to be ready for permanent exhibition in March, 1865.

Godley Head (Banks' Peninsula) Lighthouse

Godley Head Lighthouse is situated on Godley (or Cachalot) Head, forming the North-western entrance of Port Lyttelton, Banks' Peninsula, in $43^{\circ} 35' 32''$ South latitude, and $172^{\circ} 49' 30''$ East longitude, as measured on the Admiralty Chart.

The light will be a Fixed Dioptric White Light, of the second order, is elevated about 450 feet above the level of the sea, and illuminating an arc of 200° . It will be visible from seaward, in clear weather, about 29 nautical miles, and at lesser distances, according to the state of the atmosphere, from E. $\frac{1}{4}$ S., round by the North to about N.N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W.

The Tower will be thirty feet in height from base to vane.

This light is expected to be ready for permanent exhibition about March, 1865.

Tairoa's Head Lighthouse.

Tairoa's Head Lighthouse is situated on the head-land bearing that name, on the East or seaward side of the entrance to Otago Harbour, in $45^{\circ} 47'$ South latitude, and $170^{\circ} 45'$ East longitude, as measured on the Admiralty Charts.

The Light will be a fixed Dioptric Red light of the 3rd order, and will be seen to seaward from about E. $\frac{3}{4}$ N., round by the North to about N.W.; and up the harbour it will show from about W. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. to about S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W., the latter line indicating the turning point of the Cross Channel.

The light will be elevated about 196 feet above the level of the sea, and will be visible in clear weather about 20 nautical miles, allowing 15 feet for the height of the observer's eye, and at lesser distances according to the state of the atmosphere.

The tower, which, together with the dwelling houses, will be painted white, will be $39\frac{1}{2}$ feet high from the ground to the top of the lantern.

This light is expected to be ready for permanent exhibition on and after the night of Monday, January 2nd, 1865.

Note.—All the bearings given in the above notices, are compass bearings from the Lighthouse.

Immigration Regulations.

Superintendent's Office,

THE General Government having instructed the Superintendent of Wellington to make arrangements for a particular class of Emigration from Great Britain and Ireland to this Province, settlers who wish to obtain passages for such of their relatives or friends as are comprised within that class are requested to make application in the form printed on the other side.

The Emigrants required by the General Government are married couples and single men not over 45 nor under 16 years, accustomed to spade work, with a proportion of mechanics. No unmarried females can be provided with passages under these regulations, except they accompany and are under the care of a near relative.

The rate of passage has been fixed, until further notice, at £14 per Statute Adult, and all ships employed in this service will be under the provisions of the "Passenger Act."

Each applicant will be required to give a Promissory Note payable on demand,

for the whole amount of the intending Emigrants passage. If however, one half of such Promissory Note is paid (without discount) within twelve months after the arrival of the Emigrants sent for, the other half will be cancelled provided they remain two years in the Province; but otherwise the whole amount will be enforced.

In no case will the indebtedness of any applicant be allowed to exceed £28; *i. e.* equal to the passage of two adults. The passage money of children must therefore be paid in cash at the time of applications. Children between the ages of 1 and 12 years, will be berthed and provisioned as equal to half an adult, according to the Passenger Act; but only one-fourth of the passage money of an adult will be charged,

In the event of any Emigrants applied for declining to emigrate, whatever money may have been deposited with the Pro-

vincial Government will be returned, so soon as the Home Agent shall have apprised the Provincial Government thereof; but in the event of any Emigrants applied for ac-

ship, and so, by failing to present themselves for embarkation at the time appointed,

will be forfeited.

Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, the Home Agent will have power to refuse passages where the intending Emigrants are in ill health or in any way unfitted, according to his judgment, to undertake the voyage.
