PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor CHARLES WILLIAM SCHULTZE, Esquire, Deputy Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, in the Colony of New Zealand.

I, Charles William Schultze, Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, do hereby in pursuance of the Regulations in this behalf, proclaim and notify that the several allotments of land situate in the Rangitikei District in the Province of Wellington, and specified in the Schedule hereto, except such as may be reserved under the provision hereafter mentioned, will be put up for sale by public auction, at the Crown Lands Office, in the Town of Wellington, on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, at one o'clock in the afternoon.
