PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor Isaac Earl Featherston Esquire Superintendent of the Province of Wellington in the Islands of New Zealand.

WHEREAS on the twenty-third day of February one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six a notice dated the sixteenth day of February one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six under the hand of A. Follett Halcombe Esquire Provincial Secretary was published in the Government Gazette for the Province of Wellington that an application had been made for the alteration of the Ohariu Highways District so far as to, exclude Section 105 Ohariu from the said Highways District and that the Proclamation would be issued by the Superintendent accordingly after the expiration of six months from the date thereof unless satisfactory cause be shewn why the said Section should not be so excluded And whereas the time mentioned in such notice has expired and no satisfactory cause has been shewn why the said Section should not be so excluded Now therefore I Isaac Earl Featherston Superintendent of the Province of Wellington in pursuance of the said recited notice and by virtue and in exercise of the power and authority vested in me in this behalf Do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the date hereof the Section numbered 105 (one hundred and five) on the plan of the Ohariu District

shall be excluded from the Ohariu Highways District.

*Defining the Western Rangitikei  
School District.*

PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor Isaac Earl Featherston Esquire Superintendent of the Province of Wellington in the Islands of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Second Session of the Provincial Council of Wellington No. 6 intituled "An Act to promote the establishment of Common Schools in the Province of Wellington" it is enacted that for the purposes of the said Act it should be lawful for the Superintendent by Proclamation to divide the Province into Districts and from time to time to sub-divide such Districts and to re-unite any sub-divisions and also by Proclamation to declare that the said Act should come into operation within such District or sub-division at such time as he might appoint And whereas it

is deemed expedient to proclaim that portion of the Province within the boundaries hereinafter set forth to be a District for the purposes of the said Act Now therefore I Isaac Earl Featherston Superintendent of the Province of Wellington in virtue of the power and authority vested in me in this behalf do hereby proclaim and declare that such portion of the said Province as is comprised within the following boundaries shall form and constitute a District for the purposes of the said Act to be called "The Western Rangitikei School District" which said District shall be bounded as follows namely—

By the Northean boundaries of the Agricultural Reserve No. 2 of Blocks No. LV LVII and LVIII to the North-East corner of Block No. LVIII thence Southerly by the Eastern boundary of the said Block to the Tutaenui Stream thence by the said Stream to the South-east corner of Section LXV thence along the Southern boundary of the said Section till intersected by a line being a production of the road line between Sections 19 and 20 thence by said line Southerly till it meets the production of the Northern boundary of Block No. LXIV thence Westerly by such line and Northern boundary of the said Block No. LXIV to the Omuha Stream and by the Omuha Stream to the boundary of the Turakina and Rangitikei Districts and thence North by the said boundary to the starting point.

And also that the said Act shall come into operation within such District on the day of the date hereof.

#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor Isaac Earl Featherston Esquire Superintendent of the Province of Wellington in the Islands of New Zealand.

I ISAAC EARL FEATHERSTON Superintendent of the Province Wellington by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me in this behalf do hereby proclaim and declare that the parts of the said Province lying within the limits hereinafter specified shall form and constitute a District for the purposes of the District Highways Acts viz. :—

A line commencing at the mouth of the Wakataki river thence up that river

to where it is crossed by the main line of road thence along the main line of road to the Whareama river thence up that river to the mouth of Flag Creek thence up that stream to its source thence Southerly along the Western boundary of Buxton's run to the North-east corner of Section No. 289 thence Westerly to the North-west corner of Section No. 290 thence Southerly along the Western boundary of Section No. 290 to the Mangapakea river thence by a line to Trigonometrical Station on the top of Poronui hill thence along the Western boundary of Cameron Brothers property to Biscuit Creek thence by that stream to its junction with the Kauminga stream thence up that stream to its source thence by a straight line to Trigonometrical Station Cameron's boundary thence by a straight line to Trigonometrical Station Rewa Rewa thence by a line to the source of the Patanui stream thence down that stream to the sea coast thence by the sea to the point of commencement and that such district shall be called the "Warehama Road District."

*Making Quarantine Regulations for the Colony of New Zealand.*

At the Government House at Auckland, the 12th day of January, 1864.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in the Governor in Council by the "Marine Board Act, 1863," His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, doth hereby approve of the following Quarantine Regulations, made and issued by the Marine Board for the several Ports and Harbours in the Colony of New Zealand, and doth declare that the same shall be in force from and after the twelfth day of January, 1864.

## QUARANTINE REGULATIONS.

1. The Master of every vessel which shall be deemed by the Harbour Master to be liable to Quarantine, shall, on being directed so to do by the Harbour Master, cause such vessel to be anchored in the Quarantine Ground, appointed for the

Harbour, or forfeit the sum of £50 for every day, or portion of a day, during which he shall neglect or refuse so to do.

2. The Master of any vessel so anchored, who shall either himself quit, or permit any seaman, passenger, or other person to quit the same, except by authority from the Board of Health hereinafter mentioned, until he shall have been duly admitted to pratique, shall forfeit the sum of £50 in respect of each person who shall so quit the vessel.

3. Every person who shall so quit such vessel shall forfeit the sum of £20.

4. The Master of every vessel so anchored shall hoist a yellow flag of not less than six breadths of bunting at the main by day, and a light by night in a lanthorn such as is used in H.M. Navy, and shall keep the same respectively hoisted until released from Quarantine, otherwise he shall forfeit for each offence the sum of £20.

5. The Master of every vessel so anchored shall deliver to the Harbour Master, or other authorised person, his Bill of Health, Manifest, Log Book, and Journal, and shall fill up a report in the form pointed out by the Schedule A. annexed.

6. The Master of every vessel so anchored who shall suffer any Goods, Wares, or Merchandise, Packets, Books, Letters, or other articles to be unshipped or landed, and any person or persons who shall be concerned in the unshipping or landing of the same, shall forfeit for each and every article so unshipped or landed, the sum of £20.

7. Every person or persons who shall knowingly receive any Goods, Wares, or Merchandise, Packets, Package, Baggage, Books, or Letters, or any other article whatever, from any vessel so anchored, shall forfeit for each and every article the sum of £20.

8. Any person who, without the authority of the Board of Health, shall go within the limits of any Quarantine Station when any vessel shall be there at anchor performing Quarantine, or within the limits of any Lazaret whilst the same is occupied, shall forfeit any sum not exceeding £20, and shall be liable to be detained and kept in Quarantine as if he were a passenger of such vessel subject to Quarantine.

9. If any Officer or person entrusted with the performance of any duties respecting Quarantine shall in any way neglect his duty, he shall for each offence forfeit any sum not exceeding £20.

10. The Harbour Master or Pilot shall, immediately after any vessel shall have been anchored in Quarantine, report the same to the Resident Magistrate, and to the Health Officer of the Port, or to the person or persons acting or appointed to act for those functionaries.

11. There shall for every Port be a Health Officer, to be from time to time appointed by the Superintendent of the Province, who shall, immediately upon receipt of the said report, visit the vessel so anchored, and if he shall find that any

sickness of an infectious or contagious nature exists, or shall then recently have existed on board of her, submit full information in regard thereto to the Board of Health hereinafter mentioned.

12. The Board of Health shall consist of the Resident Magistrate of the Port, one or more Justices of the Peace, the Superior Officer of Customs at the Port, the Health Officer of the Port, and, if the Health Officer be not a Medical Practitioner, one or more legally qualified Medical Practitioners, to be appointed by the Superintendent of the Province, of which Board the Resident Magistrate shall be convener.

13. The said Board, or the majority of them, shall have authority to detain any such vessel as aforesaid in Quarantine until every symptom of any infectious or contagious disease as aforesaid shall have disappeared, and until sufficient time to prevent the spread of such disease shall in the opinion of the Board have elapsed since the last case disappeared, and thereupon to release such vessel from Quarantine, and admit her to pratique.

14. It shall be lawful for the Superintendent of any Province, upon the recommendation of the said Board, to appoint any station or place within any Port or Harbour in the said Province for the performance of Quarantine, where all vessels liable to Quarantine, and the crews, passengers, and persons on board thereof shall perform the same, and also, if necessary, to appoint Lazarets and other places where the crews, passengers, and other persons, and the Goods, Wares, and Merchandise which shall or may be on board the said vessels shall and may be detained, landed, and kept for the performance of Quarantine.

15. If any person shall, contrary to the provisions of this Act, quit any vessel in Quarantine, or go within the limits of any Quarantine Station or Lazaret, it shall be lawful for any Peace Officer or Constable to apprehend him and carry him before a Justice of the Peace, who may, if he shall think fit, grant his warrant for conveying such person back to the vessel, Quarantine Station, or Lazaret which he shall have left, there to remain and perform Quarantine.

16. The aforesaid Board shall have power to prescribe all measures necessary for cleansing, purifying, and disinfecting any vessel in Quarantine, and the passengers and crew thereof, and the Goods, Wares, and Merchandise therein, and, if necessary, to order the destruction of any clothing or materials which cannot be cleansed, purified, or disinfected.

17. During the detention of the crew or passengers of any vessel in Quarantine, whether on board or on shore, the Master of such vessel shall provide and supply provisions for the said crew and passengers on the same scale as during the voyage.

18. During the period any vessel may be in Quarantine the Resident Magistrate and Health Officer shall visit her alongside

from time to time and institute such regulations as the nature of the case may demand, and the Master or Commander shall carry such regulations into effect, or forfeit for each offence a sum not exceeding £20.

19. The Resident Magistrate at any Port for which no Harbour Master or Health Officer is appointed shall have and exercise all the powers hereinbefore given to such Officers.

1. What is the tonnage of the vessel, and her name?

5. What vessel have you had intercourse or communication with on your passage, and from whence did they come?

7. Did the Cholera, or any other highly infectious and dangerous disease, prevail at the place from which you sailed, or at any of the places at which you have touched, or on board of any vessel with which you have had communication? if so, state when and where.

8. In the course of your voyage have any persons on board suffered from sickness of any kind, what was the nature of such sickness, and when did it prevail? how many persons were affected by it, and have any of them died in the course of the voyage?

9. What number of officers, mariners, and passengers have you on board?

10. What was the number of persons on board your vessel when you sailed?

11. What is the whole number of persons now ill on board your vessel?
