Speech of His Honor the Superintendent on proroguing the Sixteenth Session of the Provincial Council.

MR SPEAKER AND GENTLEMEN OF THE PROVINCIAL COUNCIL,—

I beg to intimate that I have on behalf of his Excellency the Governor assented to the following Acts:—

An Act to amend an Act of the Superintendent and Provincial Council, Session VIII No. 1, intituled "An Act to authorise the Superintendent to cause a Wharf to be erected in the harbour of Port Nicholson."

An Act to amend an Act, intituled "An Act to shorten the notice of sale of certain lots on the reclaimed land in Wellington."

An Act to appropriate the revenue of the Province of Wellington for a term commencing from the 1st day of April, 1868, and ending the 30th day of June, 1868.

An Act to grant a piece of land at Wanganui to the Freemasons.

An Act to re-adjust the representation of the province in the Provincial Council.

An Act to appropriate the revenue of the province for the year commencing the first day of April, 1868, and ending the 31st day of March, 1869.

An Act to authorise the Superintendent to appoint a commission to enquire into, consider and report upon the state of education and operation of the law for the establishment and management of common schools.

An Act to apply a sum not exceeding £5000 in extinguishing native title to land.

I have also to inform you that having reserved the "Act to authorise the Superintendent to raise by way of Mortgage a sum not exceeding £25,000 on the unreclaimed land in the Harbour granted to him under the Public Reserves Act, 1854" for

the signification of the Governor's pleasure thereon, His Excellency has been pleased to assent to the same.

These few and unimportant Acts, far from being a matter of reproach as the sole result of your labors during a somewhat protracted session, afford to my mind a strong proof of the adaptation of our Provincial Institutions to the peculiar circumstances of the colony, and of the thoroughly satisfactory manner in which the Legislature of this Province has discharged its important functions. The almost entire absence of legislation during the present session, coupled with the equally entire absence on the part of the community of any complaints of its inadequacy or incompleteness, show that you have during the fifteen years of your existence most adequately provided by your enactments for all the present requirements of the province.

I congratulate you upon having during the present session, instead of postponing it to the eve of a general election, readjusted the representation upon a basis and in a manner which I think will meet with general acceptance. Holding as I do the opinion that there should be a certain definite period, within which the distribution of representation once made should be unalterable, I am glad that in the present Act you have, by keeping in view the direction in which the future increase to your population will flow, rendered it extremely improbable that during the next few years any fresh re-adjustment will be either necessary or called for.

I have to thank you for not having burdened the estimates with a proposed expenditure which there was no reasonable prospect of meeting. I *recognise in this your desire that the expendi-

ture shall be kept within the revenue, and I confidently rely upon the District Road Boards enabling me to carry it out, by restricting their operations during the next few months to such works only as are of urgent necessity. Towards all such works the Government will continue to contribute the usual grant in aid of two equivalents.

I fully expected to have been able to lay before you a statement of accounts between the General and Provincial Governments for the past financial year; but though the Colonial Treasurer is required by the Public Revenues Act to prepare each month an account between the General Government and the Government of each Province, he has yet only within the last few days furnished the accounts for the quarters ended on the 30th September and 31st December last, showing a considerable balance in favor of the Province, and I have reason to believe that the accounts for the succeeding quarters will give a somewhat similar result; the accounts, however, are given in such a form as to render it impossible for any Provincial Government to check them. As this is a grievance under which all the Provinces are laboring, I have no doubt that it will be remedied during the present session of the General Assembly.

You will be glad to learn that a tender for the erection of the Wanganui bridge has been accepted, so that there is every prospect of this great public work being completed within the next eighteen months.

While still retaining my own opinion that the contract entered into with Mr Owen was not only a fair and equitable one, but was most advantageous to the province, inasmuch as it got rid of endless lawsuits and secured the erection of the slip within a reasonable time, I have done my utmost to obtain such a modification in the terms of the contract as might remove the objections to it entertained by the Council; but I regret to say that in these efforts I have entirely failed, and that I fear that by the action taken by the Council, the erection of the slip will be indefinitely postponed and the province involved in fruitless litigation.

And now, thanking you on behalf of the province for the earnest consideration you have given to the various matters brought before you, I declare that this Council do stand prorogued.

*Proposed Alterations in the
Boundaries of the Mataonga-
onga, Matarawa and Makiri-
kiri Highway Districts.*

NOTICE is hereby given, in conformity with the requirements of clause 3 of the "District Highways Act, 1867," that at the expiration of six months from the publication hereof, the boundaries of the above districts will be altered as herein- under mentioned, unless sufficient evidence be meanwhile adduced to the contrary.

The adjusted boundary line between the Mataongaonga and Matarawa Highway Districts will commence from the spur of the ridge rising in Mr. Wallace's section, and continue to the top of it following the ridge until the saddle is reached behind Mr. Gregor McGregor's old whare, and

thence forward in nearly a straight line including Mr. Lynd's, to the Ohawera stream, following it to the Wangaehu.

The adjusted boundary line between the Mataongaonga and Makirikiri Highway District is the Kukuta stream from the river bank to the N. E. angle of the Waipakura reserve, following the South line of Mr. Greenway's (late Mr. Speed's) land as far as the Tawai tree, and from thence to Oeta, Wangaehu.

Boundaries of the Carterton
and Taratahi Highway Dis-

NOTICE is hereby given, in conformity with clause 3 of the "District Highways Act, 1867," that at the expiration of six months from the date of the publication hereof, the boundaries of the above districts will be altered as hereinunder mentioned, unless sufficient evidence be meanwhile adduced to the contrary.

The boundaries of the Carterton Highway Board will commence at the junction of the Maungataurera stream with the Waiohine river, thence up the Maungataurera stream until it meets a line being a continuation of the Southern boundary of sections 172, 145, 171, 89, and 1. Taratahi Plain Block, thence along the said line to the South Eastern corner of section No. 1. Taratahi Plain Block, thence on a Magnetic Bearing of 215° 31' until it strikes the Waiohine river, thence up the Waiohine river to the starting point, and the boundaries of the Taratahi Highway District will be altered accordingly.
