PROCLAMATION.

I ISAAC EARL FEATHERSTON Superintendent of the Province of Wellington do hereby in pursuance of the Regulations in this behalf proclaim and notify that the several allotments of land situate in the Township of Carterton and in the Taratahi Plain Block in the district of Wairarapa in the Province of Wellington and specified in the Schedule hereto except such as may be reserved under the provision hereafter mentioned will be put up for sale by public auction at the Crown Lands Office in the Town of Wellington on Saturday the twenty seventh day of February one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine at twelve o'clock noon.
