I WILLIAM WARING TAYLOR Deputy Superintendent of the Province of Wellington in virtue of the powers vested in me in this behalf do hereby proclaim and declare that the parts of the Province lying within the boundaries hereinafter specified shall form and constitute a district for the purposes of the "District Highway's Act," viz:
