SHIPMASTERS navigating the Wanganui River, and having occasion to pass through the bridge while under construction, are hereby notified that from and after the seventeenth day of November, 1870, until further notice be given, a space of 40 feet wide, in the works of the temporary bridge will be left open for navigation.
