Proclamation.

By His Honor William Fitzherbert,
Esquire, Superintendent of the
Province of Wellington, in the
Colony of New Zealand.

I WILLIAM FITZHERBERT, Super-
intendent of the Province of Wel-
lington, in virtue of the powers and
authority vested in me in this behalf, do
hereby proclaim the Building erected in
the Town of Wanganui, in the Province
of Wellington, aforesaid, and hitherto
known as the Rutland Stockade, to be a
Public Gaol.

Given under my hand and issued
under the public seal of the
Province of Wellington, at
L.S. Wellington, this twenty-eighth
day of March, one thousand
eight hundred and seventy-two.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington,
this 27th day of March, 1872.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN
COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Bridges and
Ferries Act, 1868 Amendment
Act, 1869," it is enacted that it shall be
lawful for the Governor in Council, at
the time of making any Proclamation
bringing "The Bridges and Ferries Act,
1868," into operation in any Province, or
at any time thereafter, to delegate all or
any of the powers by "The Bridges and

Ferries Act, 1868," vested in the Governor
and exercisable by him within the Pro-
vince in such Proclamation mentioned,
except the powers conferred by the
second section of the said Act, to the
Superintendent of the Province in which
the said Act shall be so brought into
operation as in the said first-mentioned
Act particularly set forth: And whereas
by a Proclamation bearing even date
herewith, His Excellency the Governor
has declared that, on the twenty-seventh
day of March, one thousand eight hun-
dred and seventy-two, "The Bridges and
Ferries Act, 1868," shall be in operation
in the Province of Wellington: And
whereas it is expedient that the delega-
tion hereinafter mentioned should be
made to the Superintendent of the said
Province:

Now therefore, His Excellency Sir
George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor
of the Colony of New Zealand, in persua-
sance and exercise of the powers vested in
him by "The Bridges and Ferries Act
1868 Amendment Act, 1869," and by and
with the advice and consent of the Execu-
tive Council of the said Colony, doth
hereby delegate to

WILLIAM FITZHERBERT, Esq.,
Superintendent of the Province of Wel-
lington, all the Powers by "The Bridges
and Ferries Act, 1868," vested in the
Governor and exercisable by him within
the said Province of Wellington, except
the powers conferred by the second
section of the said Act, to hold the same
to the said William Fitzherbert so long
as he shall be and remain such Superin-
tendent as aforesaid.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Bridges and Ferries Act 1868 Amendment Act, 1869," it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, declare "The Bridges and Ferries Act, 1868," to be in operation in any province, and on a day to be fixed in such Proclamation "The Bridges and Ferries Act, 1868," shall come into operation in such Province: And whereas it is expedient that the said last-mentioned Act should be brought into operation in the Province of Wellington, as and in manner hereinafter mentioned:

Now, therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said first-mentioned Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that, on the twenty-seventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, "The Bridges and Ferries Act, 1868," shall be in operation in the Province of Wellington.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, at the Government House, at Wellington; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, this twenty-seventh day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two.
