*Proclamation.*

By His Honor WILLIAM FITZHERBERT, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, in the Colony of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by the "Protection of Animals Act 1867," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Order in Council published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, delegate to the Superintendent of any Province, all or any of the powers by the said Act vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, subject to such regulations as he may think fit, and may from time to time rescind such delegations:

And whereas an Order in Council dated the eleventh day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council did delegate unto William Fitzherbert, Esq., Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, so long as he shall continue and remain Superintendant of the said Province, all the powers vested by the said Act, in the Governor or the Governor in Council, to be exercised only in respect of the said Province.

Now therefore I, William Fitzherbert, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington in exercise of the power and authority so vested in me by the above recited Order in Council do hereby proclaim and declare that "The Protection of Animals Act, 1867" shall come into force in the Province of Wellington, on and from the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two.

THE HONORABLE WILLIAM FOX, PRIME MINISTER, PRESIDING AND MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Marine Act, 1867," it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, vary, and

repeal by-laws and regulations for fixing the fees to be paid for licenses to be issued for or in respect of steam tugs, cargo boats, ballast boats, tank boats, lighters, watermen's and other boats: And whereas, by Order in Council dated the sixth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, and made under the provisions of the said Act, among other things, certain fees for licenses for cargo boats, ballast boats, and water-tank boats, stated and set forth in the Schedule to the said Order in Council were fixed to be levied and taken for the Port of Wellington as therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to repeal the same:

Kawana Hunia and others.*

THE following letter is published for the information of the Native Tribes mentioned therein:—

7, Westminister Chambers,  
Victoria street,  
Westminister, S.W., March 28, 1872.  
(England)

TO KAWANA HUNIA,

Friend,—Salutations to you. Salutations to you and to the whole of your Tribe—to the old women, and to the old men at your Kainga. I greet you—lest you should say that because I am at a distance from you, my thoughts of you have become estranged. No: my love and thoughts for you continue the same, it will never cease. I am constantly hearing the news from our Island and my heart is rejoiced on account of the termination of the evil, that is the war. This is my word to you, that is, to you all, if a thought occurs to you write to me, I will not disregard your letter, though the ocean separates us.

A Father's love to his children does not diminish, therefore my love will not diminish towards my Maori friends, at Rangitikei, at Manawatu, at Otaki, at Wairarapa and all the places adjacent to Wellington.

This is a letter of remembrance: enough.
