*Cancelling Proclamation by Superintendent
of Wellington of certain Educational
Reserves.*

(L.S.) G. F. BOWEN, Governor.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the ninth section of "The Wellington Waste Lands Regulations Amendment Act, 1871," it is enacted that the Governor, on the application of the Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, may, at any time, by Proclamation published as in the said Act mentioned, cancel any Proclamation or other instrument theretofore or thereafter to be made by such Superintendent, reserving any waste lands of the Crown, not being lands specially set apart for purposes of public convenience, health, or enjoyment within such Province, for public purposes, and on the expiration of thirty days from the publication of such Proclamation of cancellation, the lands affected thereby shall be open for sale, or occupation, or disposal, as if they had never been reserved: And Whereas by Proclamation, dated the 19th day of October last, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the Province of Wellington aforesaid, on the 28th October last, the Superintendent of the said Province did proclaim and declare that sections Nos. 1065 and 1073 in the City of Wellington; part of section No. 35, and sections Nos. 36, 38, and 40 in the Harbour District; section No. 5 in Campbell Town, Wanganui; sections Nos. 279, 280, 281, and 282

in the Town of Wanganui; suburban sections Nos. 1, 2, and 4 in the Moota Block Township of Foxton, Manawatu District; section No. 67 in the Turakina District; and sections Nos. 13 and 48 in the Waitotara District, in the said Province of Wellington, were thereby reserved and set apart by him for educational purposes: And whereas the Superintendent of the said Province has made application to me, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, to cancel the said Proclamation: Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, G.C.M.G., Governor of New Zealand, do hereby, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority vested in me in this behalf, cancel the said Proclamation so made as aforesaid by the Superintendent of the said Province.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, at the Government House, at Wellington; and issued under the Public Seal of the Colony this eighteenth day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two.

Proclamation.

By His Honor WILLIAM FITZHERBERT, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, in the Colony of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Wellington Special Settlements Act, 1871," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, with the advice and consent of his Executive Council, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, to set aside out of the Waste Lands within the Province of Wellington, the Native title of which has been extinguished, any block or blocks for the purpose of special settlement, not exceeding in the whole 100,000 acres, on such terms as may be sanctioned by the Governor in Council, anything in the existing Regulations for the management or disposal of the Waste Lands in the Province to the contrary notwithstanding. It is also provided that no land shall be sold at a less price than land of a similar description is now sold at under the Regulations aforesaid, and that the proceeds thereof shall be subject to any sum already imposed thereon by any Act of the General Assembly.

And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the 20th day of November, 1872, a block of land at Foxton, in the Manawatu District, in the said Province, is sanctioned as a special settlement under the said Act for the members of an Association formed in England for the growth, cultivation, and manufacture of the *Phormium tenax* or Flax, upon a large scale, and which said Association is represented at present by Falconer Larkworthy, Esquire, of London, Banker, upon the terms and conditions set forth in the second schedule hereto. Now, therefore, I, William Fitzherbert, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the exercise of the power in me vested, do hereby proclaim and declare that the block of land situated in the township of Foxton, in the Manawatu District, in the Province of Wellington, containing about 8,000 acres, more or less, and bounded as described in the first schedule hereto, shall be reserved and set apart as a special settlement under the said Act, and for the purposes before mentioned.

Given under my hand and issued under the public seal of the Province of Wellington, at Wellington, this thirtieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

All that piece of land estimated to contain 8,000 acres, more or less, being Rural Sections Nos. 92, 93, 94, 96, 97, 98, and 104 in the Motoa Block, Township of Foxton, and Rural Sections Nos. 434, 533, 534, and 535 in the Township of Foxton, and all that other piece of unsurveyed land in the Motoa Block, bounded towards the North by section No. 251, by a public road, by sections Nos. 435, 436, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 52, 53, 60, 61, and 101, and by the abutments of the public road between sections Nos. 29 and 30, and between sections Nos. 52 and 53; towards the North-east by sections Nos. 98 and 104, and by Block No. 1; towards the East by sections Nos. 52, 65, 66, 67, 68, 101, 102, 103, and 104, and by the abutment of a public road between sections Nos. 66 and 67; towards the South-east by sections Nos. 88, 89, 90, 91, 92, 93, 94, 96, 97, and 98, and by the abutments of the public road between sections Nos. 88, and 104, and between sections Nos. 93 and 94; towards the South by the Manawatu River and by Block No. 1; and towards the West by sections Nos. 30, 254, 251, 434, and 535, by a public road and by the abutments of a public road between sections Nos. 434 and 535, and of a road on the south side of section No. 254 and by Block No. 1. Excepting always the lands claimed by the Natives, the acreage of which is undetermined, lying within the boundaries of the last described piece of land.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Terms and Conditions for the Occupation and Purchase of the Block of Land proposed to be set aside for Special Settlement as aforesaid.

INTERPRETATION.

1. In the construction of these terms and conditions, unless the context shall otherwise require, the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them:—"Association" shall mean the Association formed in England as aforesaid. "Land" shall mean the block of land described in the foregoing Proclamation. "Purchaser" shall mean any one purchasing on behalf of the aforesaid Association, formed in England, who may purchase any of the land hereby set aside. "The said Act" shall mean "The Wellington Special Settlements Act, 1871."

2. All moneys required to be paid for the said land under these terms and conditions shall be paid to the Receiver of Land Revenue at Wellington, and receipts given by him shall be sufficient evidence of such payment as may be therein expressed.

3. The price of the land to be twenty shillings per acre, of which ten shillings per acre is to be paid on application and the balance by equal instalments, extending over a period of five years from

the date of the first payment, or at any earlier period, at the option of the Association.

4. Ten shillings per acre of the purchase money to be spent by the Provincial Government in the construction of drains and roads through the said block, the said works to be determined upon by the Provincial Engineer and the representative of the Association conjointly.

Bonus for Colonial Industries.

Colonial Secretary's Office,
Wellington, 18th November, 1872.

IN compliance with a Resolution of the House of Representatives, passed on 22nd October, 1872, a Bonus is hereby offered for the encouragement of certain Colonial Industries, namely:—

IRON.

BONUS OF £5,000.

For the production in New Zealand of 1,000 tons weight of Pig Iron, of marketable quality.

Conditions.

1. The bonus not to be given for any quantity less than 100 tons.

2. Notice of the intention to erect Iron Works and claim the bonus must be given to the Colonial Secretary, before 31st December, 1873.

3. The bonus must be claimed before the 30th June, 1875.

4. In the event of more than one claimant giving such notice, not more than seven-tenths of the bonus may be claimed by the first producer, and not more than three-tenths by the second producer; but if only one claimant becomes a producer on the above conditions, he may claim the whole of the bonus.

5. The Iron in respect of which any bonus is claimed will be examined by an officer to be appointed by the Government, who may require the production of *bona fide* account sales of quantities not less than 100 tons weight, showing that such Iron has been sold at a fair market price as Pig Iron.

STEEL.

BONUS OF £1,000

For the production in New Zealand of 100 tons weight of marketable Steel from

Magnetic or Titaniferous Iron Sand or Iron Ore.

Conditions.

1. Notice must be given to the Colonial Secretary of the intention to claim this bonus before the 30th June, 1873.

2. The claim for payment of the bonus must be made before 30th June, 1874.

3. The bonus will be paid to the producer who effects the first *bona fide* sale of the above quantity of Steel at a fair market price.

SUGAR.

BONUS OF £2,000.

For the production of 250 tons of Sugar manufactured from Beetroot in New Zealand.

Conditions.

1. Notice of the intention to claim this bonus must be given to the Colonial Secretary before 31st December, 1873.

2. Claims for payment of the bonus to be sent in before 30th June, 1875.

3. The bonus will be paid to the producer who first effects a *bona fide* sale of the amount of sugar specified.

PAPER.

BONUS OF £2,500.

For the production of 100 tons of Printing Paper, manufactured in New Zealand, by machinery.

Conditions.

1. Notice of the intention to claim this bonus must be given to the Colonial Secretary before 31st January, 1873.

2. The paper must be made by machinery, permanently established, and working in the Colony.

3. Claims for payment of the bonus must be sent in before 31st December, 1874.

4. The bonus will be paid to the producer who effects the first *bona fide* sale of the amount of Printing Paper specified.

FISH.

BONUS OF 4s. PER CWT.

This bonus will be paid on Cured Fish, dry or pickled, exported from the Colony for consumption abroad.

Conditions.

1. The bonus will be paid to the producer on the production of account sales showing that the Fish has been sold out of the Colony for fair market value.

2. The exporter to enter into a bond not to reland in the Colony any Fish on which a bonus has been paid.

3. The bonus may be claimed on all Fish exported between 1st November, 1872, and 1st November, 1879, and is to be paid out of any moneys appropriated by Parliament for the purpose.

The above rewards will be paid on the certificate of an officer appointed by Government that the conditions applicable to each reward have been complied with.
