Speech of His Honor the Superintendent on Proroguing the Twenty-Fourth Session of the Wellington Provincial Council.

MR SPEAKER AND GENTLEMEN OF THE PROVINCIAL COUNCIL,—The following Bills have already been assented to, viz:—

1. An Act to appropriate the revenue of the Province of Wellington for a term commencing from the first day of April, 1873, and ending the thirty-first day of May, 1873.

2. An Act to further amend the Acts of the Superintendent and Provincial Council relating to Toll Gates.

I now, on behalf of his Excellency the Governor assent to.

3. An Act to authorize the Superintendent to convey a piece of land at Greytown to her Majesty the Queen.

4. An Act to authorize the sale of a piece of land at Wanganui to the Ancient Independent Order of Odd Fellows.

5. An Act to further amend the Acts of the Superintendent and Provincial Council relating to Impounding.

6. An Act to amend the Diseased Sheep Act, 1872.

7. An Act to establish Local Boards in the Province of Wellington.

8. An Act to amend the Wellington Education Act, 1871.

9. An Act to amend the Highways Act, 1871.

10. An Act to appropriate the Revenue of the Province of Wellington for the period commencing the first day of April, 1873, and ending the thirty-first day of March, 1874.

The Cemeteries Bill has been withdrawn and the Council has already been informed that it is proposed to introduce a bill into the General Assembly on the subject.

The supplementary estimates have increased the proposed expenditure by the sum of £10,851, 7s 6d. For whereas the estimated expenditure for the financial year as originally proposed to you was £85,340 12s 11d, the expenditure actually sanctioned amounts to £96,192, 0s 5d. It is true that some of these supplementary estimates will not practically operate as a drain on the Provincial Treasury. But, after making an allowance on that ground, there will still remain an excess of estimated outlay over estimated income. This excess can, of course, only be met if the income should prove sufficiently elastic. I am not without hope that this may be the case; when I consider that the land revenue from the 1st April to the 17th May, instant, amounted in cash, to £31,101 1s 6d. At the same time I think it is a fitting opportunity to state that, having regard to the heavy responsibilities which the Provincial Government has now recognised as devolving on it. In reference to preparing land for settlement by way of surveys and construction of roads and bridges, it may become the duty of the Provincial Executive to submit for your consideration at a future session the advisability of raising the price of your public lands.

I express my concurrence in the following resolutions, which have been passed by the Council, viz:—

"I. That this Council recommends that the tract of land, now covered with water, extending from Te Aro Flat into Lambton Harbor, comprising 70 acres, or thereabouts, as shown on the plan annexed to this resolution, be granted to the Mayor, councillors, and citizens of the city of Wellington, as part of the Corporate property, to be reclaimed by them from the sea, so as to be converted into land suitable for building, and for purposes of public utility, and that his Honor the Superintendent be requested to concur in this recommendation."

With reference to this resolution, care must be taken that the purposes of public utility be defined and suitable conditions imposed.

"II. Whereas for the purposes of reclaiming land and constructing roads and bridges, and other works of public utility in the province of Wellington, it is expedient to provide for raising a sum of money under the authority of the General Assembly of New Zealand. Be it therefore resolved, that his Honor the Superintendent be requested to procure the passing of the following bill in the next session of the General Assembly, viz:—An Act to authorise the raising of a loan of two hundred and ten thousand pounds for the purpose of constructing certain works of public utility in the province of Wellington, and for charging the sums so borrowed against the said province."

With reference to this highly important resolution the Council may depend that the members of the Provincial Executive, who are also members of the Assembly, will use their best endeavors to carry out the wishes of the Council: which endeavors will, I feel confident, be aided by other members of the province holding seats in the Colonial Parliament.

III. "That a sum of two thousand five hundred pounds (£2500) be granted to Dr Featherston in recognition of his past services, particularly in reference to the influence which he exerted over the natives for the preservation of peace within the province during a very critical period. The money to be invested in the purchase of land."

By passing this resolution the Council has not merely done a gracious act: it has discharged a long recognized obligation at the earliest moment justified by its circumstances.

Whether the importance of the measures passed by you; the full discussion which they have received; the preparedness of those measures for your consideration, owing to which none of your time has been wasted; or the practical spirit in which the business before the Council has been dealt with by you: from any and all of these points of view, it must, I think, be admitted that the work done by you this session is calculated to increase the confidence, stimulate the progress and promote the welfare of the inhabitants of the province.

Thanking you for the confidence which you have shown in the provincial administration, I now declare this Council to be prorogued.

Board of Health Notice.

Central Board of Health,
Wellington, 8th May, 1873.

THE following clause of "The Public Health Act, 1872," is published for general information:—

Clause 26.—The business of a blood-boiler, bone-boiler, fellmonger, slaughterer of cattle, horses, or animals of any description, soap-boiler, tallow-melter, tripe-boiler, or other noxious or offensive trade or manufacture, shall not be newly established in any building or place within any district after this provision is applied to the district in which such building or place is situate without the consent of the Local Board, unless the Central Board of the Province within which such district is shall otherwise direct; and whosoever offends against this enactment shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds, and a further penalty of forty shillings for each day during which the offence is continued; and the said Local Board may from time to time make such regulations with respect to any such businesses so newly established as they may think necessary and proper, in order to prevent or diminish the noxious or injurious effects thereof.

Nothing in this section shall be construed to render lawful any act, matter, or thing whatsoever which but for this section would be deemed to be a nuisance, nor to exempt any person from any liability, prosecution, or punishment to which he would have been otherwise subject in respect thereof.

REGULATIONS under Clause 21 of "The Public Health Act, 1872," to be enforced in the Wellington Highway District as far as regards the village of Kai-warra-warra:—

I. That the Inspector of the Board, acting under instructions from the Board, shall visit the district and inspect such premises as may to him seem to require such inspection as often as may be deemed necessary, and shall report to the Board thereon.

II. That on complaint being made by the Inspector of the state of any premises the Board shall forthwith give notice in writing to the occupier of such premises to take such steps for the abatement of the nuisance as the Inspector shall think fit, and if such steps are not taken within twenty-four hours of the serving of such notice, then the Inspector shall take the necessary steps himself at the cost and expense of the said occupier.

III. That a medical man shall inspect the said village of Kai-warra-warra from time to time as he shall be instructed by the Board, as long as the same shall be deemed necessary, and report thereon to the Board.

Proclamation.

By His Honor William Fitzherbert, Esquire, C.M.G., Superintendent of the Province of Wellington in the Colony of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by Section 38 of "The Protection of Animals Act 1867" it is enacted that the Governor may by order in Council published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, from time to time delegate to the Superintendent, or Executive of any Province or to any other person or persons within the said Colony, all or any of the powers by the said Act vested in the Governor or Governor in Council, subject to such regulations as he may think fit.

And whereas the Governor did, by Proclamation published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, dated the twelfth day of February, 1873, delegated the said powers to William Fitzherbert, Esq., Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, so long as he shall continue and remain Superintendent of the said Province, to be exercised only in the said Province.

And whereas by the 11th Section of "The Protection of Animals Act 1867," it is enacted that no game shall be hunted, shot, taken, or killed, in any part of the Colony, until the same shall have been proclaimed as open for that purpose by order in Council, in that behalf, and no game shall be hunted, shot, taken or killed, except during the months of May, June, or July, in any year; and whereas by the 4th Section of the "The Protection of Animals Act 1872," it is further enacted that so much of Section 11 of "The Protection of Animals Act 1867," as permits game to be hunted, shot, taken, or killed, during the month of July is hereby repealed.

Now, therefore, I, William Fitzherbert, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, do hereby proclaim and declare that game shall be open to be hunted, shot, taken, or killed, within the Province of Wellington, during the months of May and June, according to the above recited provisions of the said Act.
