THE following resolution has been forwarded by the Wanganui and Waitotara Highway Board:—

“Wanganui and Waitotara Highway Board, Wanganui 5th May, 1873.

“The Board having considered the several objections made to the line of the proposed Swamp Road, deem it desirable to construct the same, according to the line laid off by the Board's Engineer, and shown in the plan and section, and hereby order the same to be constructed.”

Under the provisions of the thirty-third Clause of “The Highway Board, Empowering Act 1871,” I, William Fitzherbert, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, do hereby appoint that the objections referred to in the above resolution shall be heard at the Superintendent's Office, in the buildings belonging to the Provincial Government, on the Reclaimed Land in the City of Wellington, on Thursday, 12th day of June, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, at twelve o'clock noon.

Proclamation.

By His Honor William Fitzherbert, Esquire, C.M.G., Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, in the Colony of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by “The Lunatics Act 1868,” it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, by Proclamation published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, proclaim any house

or building provided or deemed suitable for the reception of Lunatics, and wholly or in part supported out of any money appropriated for the purpose by the General Assembly, or wholly or in part supported by or at the cost of any Province or County, or other division of the Colony, a Public Asylum within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas by Order in Council dated the twelfth day of February, 1873, His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the then Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority for that purpose vested in him did order and direct that all the powers, functions, duties and authorities vested in or required to be preformed by the Governor or the Governor in Council, or the Colonial Secretary by the aforesaid Act, within the Province of Wellington, shall be exercised by the Superintendent of such Province.

Now, therefore I, William Fitzherbert, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, do hereby proclaim the building known as “The Wellington Lunatic Asylum,” situated in the Province of Wellington, and erected upon a portion of the Wellington Town Belt, being a house or building provided and deemed suitable for the reception of Lunatics, and wholly or in part supported at the cost of the Province of Wellington, to be a Public Asylum within the meaning of “The Lunatics Act 1868.”

Given under my hand and issued under the public seal of the Province of Wellington, at Wellington, this twenty-second day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.

The Grants to be issued in the name of William Reed, the legal estate being antevested in the Grantee for the Town Land from the 1st day of October, 1840, and in the Rural Land from the 7th April, 1842, subject to a direction of the Commissioner.
1547	1725	Representative of the late William John Wright.	Entitled to a Crown Grant of the Rural Section No. 51 on the plan of the Porirua District, and of an undivided moiety of and in the Section No. 176 on the plan of the City of Wellington, the Grants to be issued in the name of William John Wright. The legal estate in the Rural Land to be antevested in the Grantee as from the 3rd day of June, 1841, and in the Town Land as from the 30th July, 1840.
1548	1726	Thomas Bridge ...	Entitled to a Crown Grant of the Rural Section No. 10 on the plan of the Makara District, and of an undivided moiety of and in the Section No. 176 on the plan of the City of Wellington. The legal estate in the Rural Land to be antevested in the Grantee as from the 18th November, 1841, and in the Town Land as from the 30th October, 1841.
1549	1727	Robert Perry ...	Entitled to a Crown Grant of the Section No. 139 on the plan of the City of Wellington; also, to a Crown Grant of 100 acres of Rural Land in accordance with the provisions of Clause VI. or II. (as the case may be) of "The Land Orders and Scrip Act, 1858."
1550	1728	George Moore...	Entitled to a Crown Grant of part of Section No. 489 on the plan of the City of Wellington. The legal estate to be antevested in the Grantee as from the 22nd August 1867.
1551	1729	William Lyon ...	Entitled to a Crown Grant of 5 acres of Rural Land in the Karori District, part of Section No. 36, Allotment No. 20 on the subdivisional plan of the Section. The legal estate to be antevested in the Grantee as from the 14th January, 1858.
