Highway Construction Order.

THE following Resolution has been forwarded by the Masterton Highway Board:—

"The Board having considered the objections against the construction of the road from the Taueru River to Wainuioru, hereby order the construction of the said road in accordance with the plan as advertised for inspection."

Under the provisions of the thirty-third clause of "The Highway Boards Empowering Act, 1871," I, WILLIAM FITZHERBERT, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, do hereby appoint that the objections referred to in the above resolution shall be heard at the Superintendent's Office, in the buildings belonging to the Provincial Government, on the Reclaimed Land, in the City of Wellington, on Tuesday, the 26th day of May, 1874, at 2 o'clock p.m.

By His Honor William Fitzherbert, Esquire, C.M.G., Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, in the Colony of New Zealand.

I, WILLIAM FITZHERBERT, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, in the Colony of New Zealand, by virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the tenth section of "The Protection of Animals Act, 1873," do hereby proclaim and declare that it shall be lawful for any person duly licensed under the said Act to hunt, shoot, take, or kill game within the

Province of Wellington, between the tenth day of May and the tenth day of July in each and every year, both inclusive. And I do further proclaim and declare, by virtue of the power conferred upon me by the fourteenth section of the said Protection of Animals Act, that game shall not be hunted, shot, taken, or killed in any part of the said Province of Wellington south of the Rangitikei River.

THE following Rules, passed by the Wanganui Acclimatization Society, have been registered in the Office of His Honor the Superintendent, in accordance with the provisions of the fourth clause of "The Protection of Animals Act, 1873."

Rules of the Wanganui Acclimatization Society.

1. This Association shall be called "The Wanganui Acclimatization Society."
2. The objects of this Society shall be the introduction, acclimatization, and domestication of all animals, birds, fishes, and plants, whether useful or ornamental.
3. The Society shall consist of a chairman, life members, members, and honorary members.
4. Every donor of ten pounds, in one sum, shall become a life member; every

subscriber of one guinea per annum shall be a member.

5. The Committee may confer the honorary membership on such persons as have, in an especial manner, contributed to the objects of the Society.

6. The office-bearers shall consist of a Chairman and a Committee of members, exclusive of the Honorary Secretary and Treasurer, who shall be members *ex officio*; three to form a quorum at all meetings.

7. The Chairman and Committee of Management shall be elected at each annual general meeting of members, after which the meeting shall proceed to elect an Honorary Secretary and Treasurer; the same meeting shall then elect an Auditor, whose duty shall be to audit the accounts of the Society at the termination of each year.

8. Any vacancies which may occur in the Committee, or its officers during the year shall be filled up by the said Committee.

9. The Committee shall meet on the first Tuesdays in January, April, July, and October, to conduct the business of the Society.

10. All meetings of the Committee shall be called together by the Secretary by circular, issued not less than four days previous to the day of meeting.

11. The annual general meeting of members shall be held in January.

12. The Committee shall have power to call such general meetings of members as may appear to it desirable.

13. At all meetings a majority of votes shall decide a question. The Chairman shall have an original and casting vote.

14. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep the minutes, and generally to give effect to the resolutions of the Society.

15. The Treasurer shall keep account of all moneys received and paid, and make out a balance sheet to be produced at each annual meeting. He shall keep a list of all members, with their addresses.

16. The annual subscriptions shall be due on the first day of January in each year.

17. No alteration or addition to these Rules shall be made unless at a general meeting, or special meeting called for the purpose.
