Regulation No. 6.

REGULATION AS TO SLAUGHTER HOUSES.

IN pursuance of Subdivision 2 of Part VIII, Schedule 13, of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1867," the Council of the Borough of Wanganui make the following regulations, that is to say:—

1. The annual sum to be paid for a license for every slaughter-house now in use within the Borough shall be twenty-shillings (20s.), and for every slaughter-house to be hereafter opened forty shillings (40s.), such sums to be payable in advance; such license to commence on the first day of July in every year, and end on the thirtieth day of June following.

2. It shall be the duty of the owner or lessee of any slaughter-house to provide the animals, while kept there, with a sufficient supply of water, to the satisfaction of any person appointed in that behalf by the Council.

3. That no cruelty shall be committed in any slaughter-house.

4. The owner or lessee of every slaughter-house shall keep the same in a cleanly and proper state, and remove all offal, refuse, and filth to such place as shall be prescribed from time to time by the Council.

5. That every slaughter-house shall at all times be open to the inspection of the Inspector of Nuisances, or such other person as may from time to time be appointed in that behalf by the Council.

Bye-Law No. 5.

BYE-LAW of the Council of the Borough of Wanganui, made under Special Order of the said Council, dated the seventeenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, confirmed the twenty-fourth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and sealed with the common seal of the said Borough this twenty-fourth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four.

In pursuance of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1867," and "The Wanganui Bridge and Wharf Act, 1872," the Council of the Borough of Wanganui ordain as follows, that is to say:—

1. The regulations set forth in the second Schedule to "The Wanganui Bridge and Wharf Act, 1872," and Bye-Law No. four (4) of the said Council shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. Vessels discharging cargo shall be allowed one clear day (Sundays and holidays not included) for every thirty (30) tons register, and vessels loading two days for every thirty (30) tons free of charge; after this time to pay one penny per ton per day.

3. All hulks when lying outside a vessel for the purpose of delivering or receiving coal shall be exempt from wharf dues.

4. The wharfinger shall give receipts for all goods, and supply the necessary labor for loading and unloading drays without further charge.

5. For all goods, excepting wool, flax, and tow, if stored, there shall be paid one shilling and sixpence per ton; and for wool, flax, and tow, sixpence per bale, such charge to include labor of receiving to or from ships' sides, and seven days' storage; after that time storage for wool, flax, and tow to be sixpence per bale per week, and for other goods two shillings per ton per week.

6. The wharfinger shall be responsible for all bonded goods landed on the wharf until three (3) p.m., and for all free and duty paid goods until four (4) p.m. On all goods landed after that hour he shall, in addition to the usual wharfage, be allowed to make a charge of one (1) shilling per ton on the owner or master of the vessel from which the goods are landed. All goods not removed from the wharf by five (5) p.m. may be stored by the wharfinger, and he shall be allowed to make a charge for storage on such goods of two (2) shillings per ton per week, or any part of a week, exclusive of carting. Provided that all goods landed on any wharf shall be free of storage charges for twenty-four (24) hours after landing. Provided also that all goods landed on the wharf from any other port which are for *bona fide* transshipment, as shown on a bill of lading or boat note, shall be allowed seven (7) days storage free of charge.

7. The wharfinger shall receive at the ship's side all goods landed, give receipts for the same, and be responsible for their delivery to the carters or other persons appointed by the consignees, and provide labor for loading drays and for weighing, measuring, and examining, making up and marking dutiable and bonded goods, and shall also provide the necessary weighing machines as may be directed

by the Commissioner of Customs, without further charge. Provided always that the wharfinger shall not be compelled to sign a receipt for any goods until twenty-four hours after landing, unless previous to the same being landed he is furnished by the master or other person in charge of the vessel, or by the owners or agent of such vessel, with a true copy of the manifest or freight list.

8. The wharfinger shall provide labour for unloading from drays goods intended for shipment, and, if required by the shipper, shall give receipts for the same, and obtain the signature of the mate or purser to shipping notes without further charge.

9. The wharfinger to provide weighing machines for colonial produce transhipped.

10. Ballast and coal shall not be deposited on any wharf. Any person offending against this regulation shall pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

11. When coal or ballast is being loaded or discharged, the person loading or discharging shall provide means to prevent any portion thereof falling into the water, and any person offending against this regulation shall pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

12. Vessels belonging to the Imperial or Colonial Government shall be allowed to lie alongside free of charge, and all stores, the property of such Governments, shall be landed or shipped free of wharfage dues. Labour in connection with such landing or shipping to be provided by such Governments respectively.

13. If the wharfinger, on application neglect or refuse to make delivery before six o'clock p.m. to owners, or the authorised agents of the owners of goods placed on the wharf before four o'clock p.m. of the same day, and it shall be necessary for the preservation of such goods that they be placed in any shed on or near the wharf, the same shall be placed in such shed at the cost of the wharfinger; but in the case of goods placed on the wharf after four o'clock p.m., such cost shall be borne by the owners of the vessels from which such goods are landed.

14. In case any horse or other animal shall be used in hauling up cargo from any vessel alongside either wharf, the master, owner, or agent of the vessel from which cargo is so hauled up shall pay to the wharfinger threepence per ton for every ton of such cargo in addition to the hire of such horse.

15. The following tolls shall be charged in respect of the several articles against which such tolls appear, when such articles are landed or shipped from the wharf, or moved from one vessel to another over the wharf:—

Wool, Flax, and Tow	- - -	3d. per bale
Grain and Flour	- - -	1s. 0d. „ ton
Coal	- - -	1s. „ ton
Horses, bullocks, and large animals	- - -	6d. each
Sheep, pigs, and small animals	- - -	1d. each
Carriages, carts, and similar vehicles, being cargo	- - -	1s. 6d. each
Shingles	- - -	6d. per 1000
Bricks	- - -	4s. „ 1000
Timber	- - -	2s. 6d. „ 1000ft superficial
Hides	- - -	1d. each
All other articles	- - -	1s. per ton

16. When any goods or articles are transhipped from one vessel to another alongside the wharf without being placed on or carried over the wharf, tolls at half the above rates shall be charged, except for coal, which shall in that case be free.

17. Goods of all kinds carried in hand shall be free.

18. Passenger vehicles shall pay sixpence for each time of going on the wharf.

Bye-Law No. 6.

BYE-LAW of the Council of the Borough of Wanganui, made under special order of the said Council, dated the Seventeenth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, confirmed the Twenty-fourth day of April, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and sealed with the common seal of the said Borough this Twenty-fourth day of April, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four.

In pursuance of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1867," and "The Wanganui Bridge and Wharf Act, 1872," the Council of the Borough of Wanganui ordain as follows, that is to say—

1. On and after the First day of September, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, Earth Closets shall be used at every Dwellinghouse, Hotel, Office, and Shop, within that portion of the Borough bounded north-east by the Market Place, north-west by Ridgway Street, south-west by Wilson Street, and south-east by Taupo Quay.

2. If the Occupier for the time being of any Dwellinghouse, Hotel, Office, or Shop, within the portion of the Borough hereinafter defined shall neglect to have and maintain such Earth Closet as aforesaid, or shall refuse to allow the Inspector of Nuisances to enter upon and view the premises in his occupation, at all reasonable hours, or shall neglect to give notice to the nightman duly authorised by the Council, when any earth-closet on the premises shall require emptying, or shall refuse to allow the nightman appointed by the Council to enter upon the premises in his occupation at all reasonable hours for the purpose of emptying any such earth-closet, he shall in any such case be liable on conviction to any penalty not exceeding five pounds.

3. The occupier for the time being as aforesaid shall pay to the nightman the sum of two shillings and sixpence for and in respect of each emptying of any earth-closet on the premises of such occupier.

4. On and after the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, the following tolls shall be payable at the Wanganui Bridge, in lieu of those now payable in respect of the same, foot-passengers, animals, and vehicles, and as regards vehicles whether such vehicles shall be loaded or unloaded.

Section I.—For every two-wheeled vehicle, with or without springs, drawn by one horse	... 1 0
For every additional horse	... 0 6
For every four-wheeled vehicle, with springs, drawn by one horse	... 1 6
For every additional horse	... 0 6
For every saddle horse	... 0 6

Provided that no tolls shall be taken on such vehicles or animals as shall re-pass on the same day, reckoning from midnight midnight.

Section II.—For every timber wain drawn by two horses	... 2 0
For every additional horse	... 0 6
For every four-wheeled vehicle, without springs, drawn by two horses	... 2 0
For every additional horse	... 0 6
For every other horse not in harness, and head of other great cattle	... 0 3
For every sheep or other small cattle	... 0 1
For every foot passenger	... 0 1

5. The Toll Collector shall issue a return ticket to any horseman or person driving any such vehicle as mentioned in Section I of the last preceding clause, which ticket shall not be transferrable, and in the event of such person desiring to re-pass any such vehicle or animal through the toll-gate on the same day, and not surrendering his return ticket, he shall be liable to pay toll again.

6. That all children under twelve (12) years of age shall be allowed to pass and repass the bridge for the purpose of attending school upon payment to the Toll Collector of five shillings per quarter, payable in advance, and on producing a certificate from the master or mistress of the school at which such child attends to the effect that such child is attending such school, and is likely to be a regular attender thereat for the ensuing three months.

7. The owner of any cattle found wandering at large shall be liable on conviction to a penalty in respect thereof of not less than one shilling per head nor more than twenty shillings per head for great cattle, and not less than sixpence per head nor more than ten shillings per head for small cattle, and in the construction of this and the next succeeding clause the words "great cattle" shall be taken to mean horses, geldings, mares, colts, fillies, asses, mules, bulls, oxen, cows, heifers, steers, and calves; "small cattle" shall be taken to mean rams, ewes, wethers, lambs, goats, and swine; and the word "cattle" shall mean both great cattle and small cattle.

8. Any cattle found wandering at large may be impounded by any person or persons, and the owner thereof shall not be entitled to redeem the same until he shall have paid the poundage fees for the time being payable in respect of cattle impounded by reason of their trespassing on occupied land; and all laws for the time being in force in reference to the impounding of cattle trespassing on land shall apply to the case of cattle impounded by reason of their wandering at large so far as such laws are not repugnant to this bye-law.

9. Cattle when being driven to the pound may be released by the owner on his or her paying to the poundkeeper previous to such cattle being impounded the sum of one shilling per head for great cattle, and sixpence per head for small cattle, in addition to an amount sufficient to cover any damage which may have been caused by such cattle.

10. Regulation No. 2 of the said Council is hereby repealed. Any person who shall drive cattle through any part of the borough of Wanganui between the hours of eight o'clock a.m. and five o'clock p.m., without giving one half hour's previous notice of his intention so to do to the person for the time being in charge of the Police Force in the said Borough shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding five pounds. Provided that nothing herein contained shall apply to horses driven in harness or to oxen in yoke.

11. Clause 7 of Part VII of the 13th Schedule to "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1867," shall be read as if the word "furze" occurred immediately after the word "bushes" therein, and as if the following words occurred at the end of such clause—"that is to say." Provided always

that this clause shall not apply to any furze hedge which is kept properly trimmed to the satisfaction of some person to be appointed in that behalf by the Council, and which is at least one chain distant from any building and is kept from encroaching on any thoroughfare.

12. Any person who shall neglect to cut down any thistles or furze growing on land in his occupation, or on any thoroughfare on which such land may abut, for the period of three days after having received notice to cut down the same from some person appointed in that behalf by the Council, shall on conviction forfeit any sum not exceeding five pounds.
