WHEREAS by "The Highways Act, 1874," section 16, it was enacted that all moneys or properties which at the time of the passing of the said Act should be in the possession or control of any person or persons who was or were or might have been acting in the capacity of Secretary or Treasurer to or in any other capacity in the service of the Board of Wardens or Highway Board constituted or elected under the provisions of an Act of the Superintendent and Provincial Council formerly in force, and called "The District Highways Act, 1867," hereinafter called the original Act, and which were or was in the possession and control or such person or persons, by virtue of his or their having been acting in any such capacity as aforesaid, and which do belong to or ought to be paid over to any Highway Board constituted under the original Act, or "The Highways Act, 1874," should go and belong to and vest in such Highway Board as the Superintendent may by order in writing direct or appoint: Now, therefore, I, William Fitzherbert, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, do hereby order, direct, and appoint that all the moneys or property which at the time of the passing of "The Highways Act, 1874," was in the possession or control of George Maunder, of Rangitikei, who acted in the capacity of Treasurer to and in the service of the Upper Rangitikei Highway Board, constituted under the provisions of the said Act of the Superintendent and Provincial Council, formerly in force, and called "The District Highways Act, 1867," and which are or is in the possession or control of the said George Maunder by virtue of his having been acting in such capacity as aforesaid, and which do belong to or ought to be paid over to the Rangitikei Highway Board, constituted under "The Highways Act, 1871," as amended by "The Highways Act, 1871, Amendment Act, 1873," or the Rangitikei Highway Board, constituted under "The Highways Act, 1874," shall go and belong to and vest in the Highway Board for the District of Rangitikei, called "The Rangitikei Highway Board," constituted and incorporated under "The Highways Act, 1874."

WHEREAS, in pursuance of the 18th section of "The Highways Act, 1874," I have been called upon by the Rangitikei Highway Board to exercise the powers vested in me under the 14th, 15th, and 16th sections of "The Highways Act, 1874," and I have this day, by order under my hand, directed and appointed that all the moneys or property which at the time of the passing of "The Highways Act, 1874," were or was in the possession of George Maunder, of Rangitikei, who acted in the capacity of Treasurer to and in the service of the Upper Rangitikei Highway Board, constituted under the provisions of an Act of the Superintendent and Provincial Council formerly in force, and called "The District Highways Act, 1867," and which are or is in the possession or control of the said George Maunder, by virtue of his having been acting in such capacity as aforesaid, and which do belong to or ought to be paid over to the Rangitikei Highway Board, constituted under "The Highways Act, 1871," as amended by "The Highways Act, 1871, Amendment Act, 1873," or to the Rangitikei Highway Board constituted under "The Highways Act, 1874," should go and belong to and vest in the Highway Board for the District of Rangitikei, called "The Rangitikei Highway Board," constituted and incorporated under "The Highways Act, 1874." Now therefore I, William Fitzherbert, C.M.G., Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, do hereby require, order, direct, and appoint that George Maunder, of Rangitikei, shall produce and exhibit to me within the period of twenty-one (21) days from the date of this order all books of account, rate books, papers, documents, or other property which belong or heretofore belonged to the Upper Rangitikei Highway Board constituted under "The District Highways Act, 1867," or to the Rangitikei Highway Board constituted under "The Highways Act, 1871," as amended by "The Highways Act, 1871, Amendment Act, 1873," or under "The Highways Act, 1874," or shall furnish to me within the said period of twenty-one (21) days from the date of this order a true and accurate account in writing of all such books of account, rate books, papers, documents, or other property.

Proclamation.

By His Honor William Fitzherbert,
Esquire, C.M.G., Superintendent
of the Province of Well-
ington, in the Colony of New
Zealand.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the General Assembly, intituled "The Wellington Rivers Act, 1875," hereinafter called "the said Act," it is provided that the Superintendent may from time to time decide that any part or parts of the Province shall be constituted a district for the purposes of the said Act, and shall describe the limits of such district and designate the name by which such district shall be known, and mention the number of conservators, being not less than three, nor more than five, of which the Board of the district shall be constituted, and shall take the necessary steps for the constitution of a Board of Conservators for such district.

Now, I, William Fitzherbert, C.M.G., do hereby declare that the portion of the Province of Wellington, more particularly described in the first Schedule hereto, shall be constituted a district for the purposes of the said Act, and shall be designated by the name of "The Waiohine River District," and that the number of the Board of Conservators to be elected for said district shall be five.

And I do hereby further declare that the regulations contained in the second Schedule hereto shall be the regulations under which the elections of members of the Board of the said district shall be conducted.

THE WAIOHINE RIVER DISTRICT.**SCHEDULE I.**

That portion of the Province of estimated to contain about 8,000 acres; bounded towards the north by the Matarawa Road; towards the east by the main line of road from Wellington to Masterton, north of the Waiohine River, and by the Waiohine and Ruamahunga Rivers; towards the south and south-west by a public road running through sections Nos. 43 and 44, and along the southern boundary of section No. 45, Moroa Block; by a straight line from the south corner of section No. 45 to the north

corner of section No. 39; by lines so as to exclude sections Nos. 38, 39, 40, and 54, Moroa Block; and sections Nos. 70 and 73, settlement of Greytown; and by the production of the northern boundary of section No. 70 to the Ruamahunga River; and towards the north-west by section No. 41, Moroa Block, and by the production of the south-eastern boundary of the said section across the Waiohine River till it intersects the Matarawa Road.

SCHEDULE II.

1. The ratepayers entitled to vote at the election of a member or members of the Board of conservators of the Waiohine River District shall meet at a convenient time and place appointed by the Superintendent a notice of which shall be posted in some conspicuous place in the district and published in at least one newspaper circulating in the district and at such meeting a person called the presiding officer to be appointed by the Superintendent shall preside.

2. Every candidate shall be proposed by one qualified voter and seconded by another.

3. If at the first election the number of candidates proposed and seconded shall not exceed five, the presiding officer shall declare such candidates elected.

4. If at the first election more than five candidates and at any subsequent election more than one candidate are or is proposed and seconded, until the number of candidates elected shall be equal at the first election to the number of the Board, or at any subsequent election to the number of vacancies therein, the presiding officer shall put the names of all such candidates to the meeting in order and shall call for a show of hands in respect of each candidate successively and if the show of hands for two or more candidates shall be equal the presiding officer shall choose by lot the member or members to be elected, and the candidate in whose favor the presiding officer shall declare the show of hands or such choice by lot to be shall be by him declared to be elected unless a poll be forthwith demanded by another candidate.

5. If a poll be demanded the presiding officer shall forthwith declare to the meeting the day and place at which the poll shall be taken and at such day and place the poll shall be taken accordingly in the following manner:—

1. The poll shall commence at nine o'clock in the forenoon and continue till four o'clock in the afternoon.
2. The presiding officer with such assistants as he shall think necessary shall attend at the appointed place furnished with poll books and pens and ink.
3. Every person desirous and qualified to vote at such election shall appear in person at the appointed time and place and shall state to

the presiding officer or one of his assistants the name of the candidate for whom he desires to vote and the said presiding officer or assistant shall enter the same in the poll book and cause the voter to sign his name or set his mark thereto.

4. The presiding officer shall as soon as conveniently may be after the close of the poll ascertain the number of votes given for each candidate and shall declare that candidate in whose favour the greatest number of votes shall appear to have been given to be duly elected. In case of equality of votes for two or more candidates the member or members shall be chosen from such candidates by lot.

6. When the presiding officer has declared any candidate duly elected he shall forthwith send to the Superintendent notice in writing of the name of such candidate for publication in the *Provincial Gazette*.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation, bearing date the 29th day of July, 1874, under the hand of the Superintendent, issued under the Public Seal of the Province of Wellington, and published in the Government Gazette of the said Province, on the 31st day of July, 1874, the following among other regulations was made in reference to candidates applying for the appointment of Pilot for the Port of Wellington:—"The candidate applying for the appointment of Pilot for the Port of Wellington must have served at least one year as Master of a square-rigged sailing vessel, of not less than two hundred tons register." And whereas it is expedient to amend the said regulation: Now, therefore, I, William Fitzherbert, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, do hereby proclaim and declare that, by virtue of the delegated powers vested in me under and by virtue of "The Marine Act, 1867," the above-mentioned regulation shall be cancelled, and further I do hereby proclaim and declare that the regulation in the Schedule hereto shall come into operation and shall be in force

on and after the 3rd day of December, 1875.
