**W**HEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury intituled the "Government Gazette Ordinance Session I. No. 2" it is enacted that "there shall be a Government Gazette for the Province for the publication of all Public and Official Acts instruments and notifications," and it is thereby also enacted that "the Superintendent may cause the Government Gazette to be printed and published at such times by such persons and generally in such manner as he shall think fit, but nothing shall be printed or published therein except by direction of the Superintendent," and it is thereby also enacted that "printed copies of such Gazette published by and in the name of the authorized printers thereof for the time being shall be evidence in all Courts of the due publication of everything therein contained and such publication shall be considered due notice to all persons affected thereby and sufficient justification to all persons lawfully exercising any powers thereby publicly notified to be vested in them."

And whereas by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intituled the "County of Westland Act 1867" it is enacted that "That portion of the Province of Canterbury described in the Schedule thereto shall be separated from and cease to be a part of the said Province of Canterbury and shall be and be called the County of Westland," and it is also thereby enacted that "until other provisions shall be made by the General Assembly or other lawful authority the laws and ordinances of the Province of Canterbury in force within the said County at the time of the coming into operation of the said Act shall remain in force within the said County so far as the same are applicable," and it is

also thereby enacted that "all powers at the time of the passing of the said Act by law vested in the Superintendent of the said Province shall within the said County become vested in the Governor provided that the Governor in Council may from time to time delegate all or any of the said powers to such person or persons as he may think fit and subject to such limitations as he may think fit and may in like manner alter or revoke such delegations."

And whereas by an order in Council dated at Wellington the 8th day of January 1868 His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand in pursuance of the said recited power and authority by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony did by Order in Council delegate to me JOHN HALL a member of the Executive Council of the said Colony within the County of Westland all the powers heretofore of the Superintendent of the said Province of Canterbury exercisable within the district comprised in the said County, Now Therefore I the said JOHN HALL in pursuance of the said recited Ordinance Act and authority do hereby declare that there shall be a Government Gazette for the County of Westland and that the same shall be printed and published at Hokitika in the said County at least once in each month or oftener if necessity shall require and that JAMES BROWNE and JOSEPH PHILIP KLEIN of Revell-street in the said town of Hokitika Printers shall be and they are hereby declared to be the authorized Printers of the said Gazette.

**I**, JOHN HALL, Member of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand by virtue of the powers delegated to me in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor do hereby appoint GEORGE SAMUEL SALE Esquire to be Chief Commissioner of the Waste Lands Board of the County of Westland and JAMES ALEXANDER BONAR Esquire and MALCOLM FRASER Esquire to be Commissioners of the said Board. And I do further appoint the first and second Tuesday in every month to be the days on which sittings of the said Board shall be held at the hour of noon at the Land Office Hokitika. And I do further appoint that the first sitting of the said Board shall take place on Tuesday the 3rd day of March 1868.

**W**HEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of Canterbury intituled "The Gibson's Quay Ordinance Amendment Ordinance 1867" it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury to charge and recover Wharfage and Tonnage Rates on such articles landed upon the parcel of land known as Gibson's Quay and upon such vessels loading unloading or refitting at or beside such parcel of land or any wharf erected thereon at such rates as the Superintendent by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council shall from time to time determine.

And whereas by an Act of the General Assembly intituled "The Marine Act 1867" it is provided that the Superintendent of every Province shall from time to time impose and levy rates dues and charges for the use of docks wharves piers and jetties and for the landing of goods wares and merchandise thereat and thereon.

And whereas by an Act of the General Assembly intituled the "County of Westland Act 1867" it is provided that all powers which at the time of the passing of the Act were vested in the Superintendent of the said Province either solely or with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province shall within the said County become vested in the Governor provided that the Governor in Council may from time to time delegate all or any of the said powers to such person or persons as he may think fit.

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the Eighth day of January 1868 His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY Governor of New Zealand by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony did delegate to me JOHN HALL within the County of Westland all the powers heretofore of the

Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury exercisable within the district comprised in the said County.

Now Therefore I the said JOHN HALL by virtue of the powers delegated to me as aforesaid and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf do order and appoint that on and after the 1st day of March 1868 the Wharfage Rates specified in the schedule hereto annexed shall be charged on all goods landed upon the parcel of land known as Gibson's Quay aforesaid.

SCHEDULE.

- Bran, one shilling per 60 bushels
- Bricks, three shillings per 1000
- Carrots, one shilling per 2240 lbs.
- Coals, one shilling per 2240 lbs.
- Chaff, two shillings per 2240 lbs.
- Cattle, two shillings and sixpence per head
- Dairy Produce, bacon, beef, &c., one shilling per 2240 lbs.
- Flour, one shilling per 2000 lbs.
- Fruit (green), one shilling and sixpence per ton measurement
- Grain, one shilling per 40 bushels
- Horses, two shillings and sixpence each
- Lime, one shilling per 2240 lbs.
- Machinery, one shilling per 2240 lbs.
- Mangoldwurtzel, one shilling per 2240 lbs.
- Onions, one shilling per 2240 lbs
- Potatoes, one shilling per 2240 lbs
- Poultry, free
- Palings, two shillings per 1000
- Sawn timber, threepence per 100 superficial feet
- Shingles, sixpence per 1000
- Sheep and pigs, twopence each
- Slates, three shillings per 1000
- Turnips, one shilling per 2240 lbs
- Vehicles (two-wheeled) two shillings and sixpence each
- Vehicles (four-wheeled), five shillings each
- All other goods, one shilling and sixpence per ton

*Transit Shed.*

(In addition to the above charges) On goods landed at the Transit Shed, and left there for a longer time than twenty-four hours, for every week or part of a week, a Rent of two shillings per ton.

On all goods brought to the Transit Shed from other parts of the wharf to be stored—

Receiving, one shilling and sixpence per ton

Delivering, one shilling and sixpence per ton

Rent for every week or part of a week, two shillings per ton

**W**HEREAS by the Gibson's Quay Ordinance 1866 it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury to nominate and appoint a Collector or other Officer necessary to collect Rates under the said Ordinance, I, JOHN HALL, by virtue of the powers delegated to me in that behalf, do hereby appoint MORDE JOHN FRECKLETON CULLIS, Esq. to be the Collector under the said Ordinance, to collect all Rates leviable at Gibson's Quay aforesaid.
