WHEREAS, by an Order in Council, bearing date the eighth day of July, 1868, all the powers which, before the coming into operation of the "County of Westland Act, 1867," were by law vested in the Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, and exercisable within the District comprised in the said County of Westland, were by His Excellency the Governor delegated to me, the Honourable James Alexander Bonar.

Now, therefore, I, James Alexander Bonar, a Member of the Legislative Council of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers vested in me in that behalf, do hereby declare that the footpaths hereinafter described, having been well and sufficiently made and completed for the use and accommodation of foot-passengers according to the

provisions of the "Footpaths Ordinance, Session VII., No. 12," are public footpaths within the meaning of the said Ordinance.

The said footpaths are as follows:—

Extending along both sides of Revell Street from Gibson's Quay to Park Street.

Extending along both sides of Wharf Street from Gibson's Quay to Camp Street.

Extending along both sides of Camp Street from Revell Street to Tancred Street.

Extending along the north side of Gibson's Quay from Wharf Street to Sewell Street.

Extending along both sides of FitzHerbert Street from Gibson's Quay to Weld Street.

Extending along both sides of Weld Street from Revell Street to FitzHerbert Street.

WHEREAS, by the 29th Section of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to demise for mining purposes to any person for any term not exceeding fifteen years from the making of the

lease certain auriferous Crown Lands not exceeding ten acres in the whole of alluvial ground, and to grant sites for machinery, and any necessary easements for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the conditions or provisions in the said section contained.

And whereas His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, did on the eighth day of July, 1868, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, delegate to me, the Honourable James Alexander Bonar, a Member of the Legislative Council of the Colony of New Zealand, the powers vested in him by the said twenty-ninth Section of the "Gold Fields Act, 1866": Now, therefore, I, James Alexander Bonar, a Member of the Legislative Council of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers vested in me in that behalf, do hereby give notice that on the 10th day of November, 1868, I intend to demise to the persons named in the Schedule hereto annexed certain auriferous Crown Lands of alluvial ground for the terms specified in the said Schedule.

I, James Alexander Bonar, Member of the Legislative Council of the Colony of New Zealand, by virtue of the powers in that behalf delegated to me under "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," by His Excellency the Governor, do hereby authorise the occupation for one year from the 14th day of October, 1868, of the site upon which the track known as Card's Track is constructed, being a strip of land fifteen feet broad and about 13 miles in length, commencing at Card's Lower Store on the New River and running in an easterly direction for about 13 miles, to Messrs. Card's Upper Store, on Liverpool Bill's Gully; and I hereby authorise the collection of the tolls mentioned in the Schedule hereto annexed for the period of one year from the 14th day of October, 1868, provided that

1. The track be cut sufficiently high on the beaches of the river to let people walk up or down with safety during floods.
2. The track be kept in reasonable repair to the satisfaction of the County Engineer, all soft places being corduroyed and gravelled where gravel is obtainable.
3. Peaceable possession of the track to be given up to the Government or Grey Road Board on an infringement of either of the above conditions.
