**WHEREAS** by "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," it is enacted that Governor in Council may by warrant under his hand, from time to time, delegate to the Superintendent of any Province within the Colony all or any of the powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the said Act, subject to such regulations as he may think fit: And whereas by the fourth section of "The Diseased Cattle Amendment Act, 1865," it is enacted that the Governor may, by an Order in Council, from time to time annul, make void, or alter, or vary and make anew, any Orders in Council, regulations, appointments, or prohibitory or other declarations, made and published by the Governor, under the authority of "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," or of "The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act, 1865," or by the Superintendent of any Province, under or in pursuance of any powers delegated under the powers of delegation contained in "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," or "The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act, 1865." And whereas by the fifth section of "The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act, 1865," it is enacted that the power of annulling, making void, or allowing, or varying and making anew, any such regulations, appointments, or prohibitory or other declarations vested in the Governor by "The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act, 1865," may, from time to time, be delegated by the Governor in Council, by warrant under his hand, to the Superintendent of any Province:

And whereas by "The County of Westland Act, 1868," it is enacted that in any Act of the General Assembly, except such as relate to the election of Superintendents and Provincial Councils, and to legislation by such Councils, and to appointments of Deputy Superintendents, and to audit of Provincial Accounts, and issue of Provincial Revenue, and matters of a like kind, the word "Province" shall include "County of Westland," and the word "Superintendent" shall include, with regard to such County, any person whom the Governor may from time to time appoint to perform within such County those duties and exercise those powers under any such Act which might, if such duties and powers had to be performed or exercised within a Province, be exercised or performed by the Superintendent of such Province:

Now, therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, do hereby delegate to

JAMES ALEXANDER BONAR, Esq.,

the Chairman of the County Council for the said County of Westland within the said County, so long as he shall remain Chairman of the County Council, the several powers vested in the Governor by the second, fourth, fifth, seventh, ninth, and tenth sections of "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," aforesaid, and all the powers which by the fifth section

of "The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act 1865," the Governor in Council is authorised so to delegate subject to be rescinded as in the said Acts provided, and subject to the regulations contained in an Order in Council of even date herewith.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this fourth day of November, 1868.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

**WHEREAS** by warrant under the hand of His Excellency the Governor, bearing date this fourth day of November, 1868, the Governor has, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, delegated to the Chairman of the County Council of the County of Westland, certain powers under "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," and "The Diseased Cattle Amendment Act, 1865," subject to certain regulations to be made by the Governor in Council:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, doth hereby, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf vested in him by the Acts aforesaid, make and ordain the following Regulations:—

1. The Chairman of the County Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Chairman,") shall immediately after exercising any of the delegated powers notify the same to the Governor, and shall transmit to the Governor, particulars of all appointments and copies of all regulations made by him.

2. The Chairman shall, as soon as conveniently may be, notify all regulations made by him to the Colonial Secretary of each of the Australian Colonies, and cause the same to be published in England in the *Times* newspaper.

3. In the exercise of powers delegated under the 9th section of "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," the Chairman may either in the first instance or afterwards, from time to time, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the County, except out of any district proclaimed as infected under the said Act any port or place within the limits of such district, and every such excepted port and place shall be deemed not to be within the pro-

claimed district; and the Chairman may also from time to time by Proclamation as aforesaid, rescind any Proclamation of an infected district, wholly or as to any part thereof, and also the Proclamation of any such exception as aforesaid.

4. In the exercise of powers delegated under the 10th section of "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," the Chairman may prohibit the importation into the County, either by land or sea, of cattle from any other Province or division of the Colony, or from any particular port or place within the Colony, or across the borders of the County, or any particular part thereof.

5. In all such last-mentioned cases the Chairman shall cause notice as speedily as possible of such prohibition to be given to the Superintendent of the Province from which importation shall be prohibited, and also to the Governor.

6. The Chairman may in his discretion suspend or forbear to exercise all or any of the powers delegated to him under the said Acts.

7. The Chairman shall, as soon as may be after the commencement of each sitting of the County Council, lay before such Council copies and particulars of all appointments, regulations, acts, and proceedings whatsoever, issued, made, or done by him under the powers delegated under the said Acts.

8. If the County Council shall by resolution declare its dissent from all or any of such appointments, regulations, acts, and proceedings, such resolution shall forthwith be transmitted by the Chairman to the Governor for his consideration.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this twentieth day of November, 1868.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL

**W**HEREAS by the tenth section of "The Marine Act, 1867," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make bye-laws and regulations for regulating the management of piers, jetties, wharves, and docks, and the general regulation of the traffic on the same, and for regulating all other matters relating to the protection of life and property of passengers and others, and by such bye-laws or regulations to impose any penalty, not exceeding fifty pounds, for the breach, or neglect, or disobedience of the same, or any of them.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, and in pursuance and exercise of all powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth thereby make the following regulations and bye-laws for the purposes aforesaid.

#### REGULATIONS AND BYE-LAWS.

1. The Master, or if there be no Master the person in charge of every vessel, whether steamer or sailing vessel, being or lying alongside of any pier, jetty, or wharf in the Colony, and which vessel shall have passengers on board, or be engaged in carrying passengers, or in which, if a steamer, passengers may by law be carried, shall keep for the use of passengers or persons coming from or going on board such vessel a proper and secure gangway, with double side-rails, or stanchions with ropes rove taut through the same, the top rail or rope being not less than three feet three inches high, and shall cause such gangway to be securely fixed and to extend from one portion of the vessel's deck or side-rail to the pier, jetty, or wharf, with a good solid bearing at each end, and to be so kept fixed so long as such vessel shall be alongside such wharf, pier, or jetty.

2. In the event of the outer end of any such gangway resting on the vessel's side-rail, the Master, or if there be no Master the person in charge of any such vessel, shall keep substantial steps fixed to lead from the end of the gangway to the vessel's deck.

3. In cases in which by the preceding regulations it is required that a vessel shall have a gangway fixed, the Master, or if there be no Master the person in charge of such vessel, shall keep a proper bright light fixed over such gangway from sunset to sunrise in such a manner as to light the whole length of it properly, and shall keep such light burning bright and clear from sunset till sunrise, so long as the vessel remains alongside any pier, wharf, or jetty.

4. Any Master, or the person in charge of any vessel when there is no master thereof, who shall be convicted of any breach, neglect, or disobedience of any of the foregoing regulations or bye-laws, shall be liable to a penalty, not exceeding Fifty Pounds.

**W**HEREAS by "The Constabulary Force Ordinance Amendment Act, 1868," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to delegate to any person or persons all or any of the powers conferred on or vested in the Governor by an Ordinance of the Lieutenant-Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, intituled "An Ordinance to provide for the Establishment and Maintenance of a Constabulary Force," and to restrict any such delegation so as to enable the person or persons named therein to exercise the powers aforesaid only within any Province, County, or other division of the Colony to be specified and described in such delegation :

Now therefore I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in

pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities in that behalf vested in me, do hereby delegate to

**JAMES ALEXANDER BONAR, Esq.,**

Chairman of the County Council of the County of Westland, all the powers conferred on or vested in the Governor by virtue of the said Ordinance, intituled "An Ordinance to provide for the Establishment and Maintenance of a Constabulary Force;" and I do hereby restrict this delegation so as to enable the said James Alexander Bonar to exercise the powers aforesaid only within the County of Westland, as defined in "The County of Westland Act, 1868."

**WHEREAS** by "The Gold Mining Claims Drainage Act, 1868," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, to delegate to the Superintendent of any Province, or to such other person as the Governor may deem fit, within any Province, County, District, or Division of the Colony, and subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as the Governor may think fit, all or any of the powers by the said Act vested in the Governor, except such powers as are therein directed to be exercised by the Governor in Council; and that whenever the Governor shall have delegated the powers thereby conferred on him, or any of them, the Governor shall also appoint a *Gazette* or Newspaper in which such Delegate shall cause to be published such Proclamations and instruments and other matters made or done by him, which would, if made or done by the Governor, be required to be published in the *New Zealand Gazette* :

Now therefore I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority in that behalf vested in me, do hereby delegate to

**JAMES ALEXANDER BONAR, Esq.,**

the Chairman of the County Council, within the County of Westland, so long as he shall continue to hold the office of Chairman as aforesaid, all the powers by "The Gold Mining Claims Drainage Act, 1868," vested in the Governor, except such powers as are by the said Act directed to be exercised by

the Governor in Council; and in further pursuance and in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me, I do hereby appoint *The County of Westland Gazette* to be the *Gazette* in which the said James Alexander Bonar, as such Delegate, shall cause to be published such Proclamations and instruments and other matters made or done by him, which would, if made or done by the Governor, be required to be published in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

**WHEREAS** by "The Lunatics Act, 1868," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, to order and direct that all or any of the powers, functions, duties, and authorities vested in or required to be performed by the Governor, or the Governor in Council, or Colonial Secretary, by the said Act, within any Province or other District of the Colony, shall be exercised or performed by the Superintendent of any such Province, or by any other person the Governor may think fit; and thereupon such functions, powers, duties, and authorities may, by such Superintendent or other person, be exercised or performed within the Province or other District of the Colony specified :

Now, therefore, His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority for that purpose vested in him, doth hereby order and direct that all the powers, functions, duties, and authorities vested in or required to be performed by the Governor in Council, or the Colonial Secretary, by "The Lunatics Act, 1868," within the County of Westland, shall be exercised by the Chairman of the Council of the said County.

A PROCLAMATION.

**W**HEREAS by "The Lunatics Act, 1868," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, proclaim any house or building provided or deemed suitable for the reception of lunatics, and wholly or in part supported out of any money appropriated for the purpose by the General Assembly, or wholly or in part supported by or at the cost of any Province or County or other division of the Colony, a Public Asylum within the meaning of the said Act :

Now therefore I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, do hereby proclaim

The Lunatic Asylum, situated in the Hospital Reserve, Hokitika,

being a house or building provided and deemed suitable for the reception of lunatics, and wholly or in part supported at the cost of the County of Westland, to be a Public Asylum within the meaning of "The Lunatics Act, 1868," aforesaid.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, at the Government House at Wellington; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, this ninth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL

**W**HEREAS by "The Public Works Land Act," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in

Council, to order that any public work to be defined in such Order shall be made, and that, after the publication of such Order in Council in the *Government Gazette*, the Governor may compulsorily take and permanently hold all such lands as may be necessary for the construction of such public work under the provisions in the said Act contained :

Now, therefore, His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, by and with the consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, doth hereby, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority in that behalf vested in him, order that the public work hereinafter defined shall be made—that is to say, that a public road shall be laid out and made over all that land described by the boundaries specified in the Schedule hereunto.

SCHEDULE.

A line commencing on the Christchurch Road at a point 1260 links, and bearing  $123^{\circ} 19'$  from Beach, traverse peg 25, following a line bearing  $63^{\circ} 50'$  for a distance of 250 links; thence following a line bearing  $47^{\circ} 30'$  for a distance of 475 links; and from thence following a line bearing  $37^{\circ} 50'$  to the Arahura River, and being of a width of 50 links on each side of the said line, all bearings magnetic and E. of N.
