**T**HE existence of small pox in one of the New Zealand Ports, and in one of the adjacent colonies, having been reported to the Government of the County of Westland, the following requirements of "The Vaccination Act, 1863," are published for general information.

[Extracts from "The Vaccination Act, 1863."]

Section 3.—The parent of every unvaccinated child born in New Zealand shall within six calendar months of the birth of such child take or cause to be taken the said child to a medical practitioner or to the medical officer appointed for the district within which the said child is resident for the purpose of being vaccinated and the said medical officer so appointed shall thereupon or as soon after as it may properly be done vaccinate the said child.

Section 4.—Upon the eighth day following the day on which any child has been vaccinated as aforesaid the parent of the said child shall again take or cause to be taken the said child to the medical practitioner or medical officer by whom the operation was performed in order that such medical practitioner or medical officer may ascertain by inspection the result of such operation.

Section 5.—Upon and immediately after the successful vaccination of any child the medical officer or medical practitioner who shall have performed the operation shall deliver to the parent presenting the said

child for vaccination a certificate under his hand according to the form of Schedule A hereunto annexed that the said child has been successfully vaccinated and shall also transmit a duplicate of the said certificate to the Registrar of Births of the district in which such operation was performed and such certificate shall be conclusive evidence of the successful vaccination of such child in any information or complaint which shall be brought for non-compliance with the provisions of this Act.

Section 8.—The Registrar of Births in every district shall on receipt of each certificate of successful vaccination enter in his register of birth opposite the name of the child mentioned in the such certificate the word "vaccinated" together with the date of such certificate and such entry when duly proved shall be admissible as evidence of the successful vaccination of such child.

Section 9.—The Registrar of Births in every district shall at the time of registration of the birth of any child cause a notice in the form of Schedule D hereunto annexed to be handed to the person registering the birth of such child for the parent of such child.

Section 10.—If after such notice the parent of any child shall not within six months after the birth of such child cause such child to be vaccinated or shall not on the eighth day after the vaccination has been performed take or cause to be taken such child for inspection then such parent so offending shall forfeit a sum not exceeding forty shillings.

Section 13.—Any person who shall inocu-

late any child or person with the virus of the disease called Small Pox shall forfeit a sum not exceeding ten pounds.

**PROCLAMATION.**

**I**, JAMES ALEXANDER BONAR, a member of the Legislative Council of the Colony of New Zealand, by virtue of the powers in that behalf delegated to me by His Excellency the Governor under "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," do hereby authorise the occupation, for one year from the date hereof, of the site upon which the Tramway from Hokitika to the Kanieri is constructed, namely, a strip of land about three miles long and ten feet broad, leading from the East Town Belt to the Kanieri Township; and do further authorise the collection for the period of one year from the 1st day of January, 1869, of the Tolls mentioned in the Schedule hereto attached. All tolls to be levied after the 31st day of December, 1869, to be fixed by notice to be published hereafter in *The County of Westland Gazette*.

**W**HEREAS by the 29th Section of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to demise for mining purposes to any person, for any term not exceeding fifteen years from the making of the lease, certain auriferous Crown Lands not exceeding ten acres in the whole of alluvial ground, and to grant sites for machinery and any necessary easements for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the conditions or provisions in the said sections contained.

And whereas His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, did, on the eighth day of July, 1868, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, delegate to me, the Honourable James Alexander Bonar, a member of the Legislative Council of the Colony of New Zealand, the powers vested in him by the said twenty-ninth section of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866": Now, therefore, I, James Alexander Bonar, a member of the Legislative Council of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers vested in me in that behalf, do hereby give notice that on the tenth day of November, 1868, I intend to demise to the persons named in the

Schedule hereto annexed certain auriferous Crown Lands of alluvial ground for the terms specified in the said Schedule.
