A PROCLAMATION.

**W**HEREAS, by "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is amongst other things enacted, that the fifth part of the said Act, including sections thirty-three, thirty-four, thirty-five, thirty-six, thirty-seven, thirty-eight, and thirty-nine, and that section fifty-two shall have no force or effect upon any gold field until after the Governor shall, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, have proclaimed and extended the operation of the said part and sections to the Province wherein such gold field shall be situate. And whereas, by "The County of Westland Act, 1868," it is enacted that the word "Province" in any Act of the General Assembly shall include County of Westland :

Now therefore I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and extend the operation of the fifth part of the said Act, including sections thirty-three, thirty-four, thirty-five, thirty-six, thirty-seven, thirty-eight, and thirty-nine, and of section fifty-two of the said Act, to the County of Westland.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, at the Government House, at Wellington; and issued under the

Seal of the said Colony, this eighth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine.

REGULATIONS OF THE COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF HOKITIKA, MADE UNDER SCHEDULE XIII., IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION 192, OF "THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION ACT, 1867."

*The Council of the Borough of Hokitika made the following Regulations under the first subdivision of the fifth part of Schedule thirteen: That is to say—*

REGULATION, ETC., OF BUILDINGS.

*First.* It shall not be lawful to use any combustible materials in the construction, alteration, repair, or renewal of chimneys, flues, smoke vents, or stove pipes.

*Second.* Every chimney to be hereafter constructed shall have a hearth not less than fourteen inches in width extending along the whole front of the fireplace; and such hearth shall not be constructed of any combustible material, nor be formed by placing any metal plate upon any combustible material.

*Third.* All chimneys, stove pipes, and vents shall be placed at a no less distance than nine inches from any timber or other combustible material.

*Fourth.* From and after the date of these Regulations coming into force, all chimneys, stove pipes, and flues, shall be carried to a height of not less than two feet above the ridge of any building.

*That is to say:—*

NUISANCES OF VARIOUS KINDS.

*First.* It shall not be lawful to keep any swine within that portion of the Borough of Greymouth commencing at the most western point of Richmond Quay, following the said Quay and Mawhera Quay in an easterly direction to its intersection with the west boundary of section No. 226 (produced): thence in a southerly direction along the north side of Chapel Street to the tidal creek: thence in a south-westerly direction along the west bank of the tidal creek to its mouth: thence westerly in a straight line to the south-east corner of Native Reserve No. 32: thence, following its south and west boundaries, to Lake Erua-moana, and from thence northerly along the bank of the said lake and Martin's Quay to the commencing point.

*Second.* It shall not be lawful for any person to empty any privy, or load, carry, or remove or deposit any nightsoil, offal, or other offensive refuse or matter, save between the hours of twelve of the clock at night and four of the clock in the morning, or to deposit the same in any other place than that appointed for the purpose, namely, between high and low-water mark, at a place on the sea beach, ten chains south of the south-west corner of leasehold section number One, and marked by a peg at its northern and southern extremity.
