#### STAMP DUTIES.

Some misapprehension appearing to exist as to the use of Impressed and Adhesive Stamps, and as to the Instruments to which

Adhesive Stamps may be affixed, the Public is informed that

All Instruments liable to Stamp Duty should be written on parchment or paper previously stamped by the Commissioners with an Impressed Stamp; but the Instruments undermentioned, *and no others*, may instead be stamped with Adhesive Stamps by the persons making or signing the Instrument:—

Agreements under hand only.

Agreements comprised in letters.

Bills of Lading.

Cheques on Banks or Bankers.

Drafts or Orders for the payment of money when liable to the duty of one penny only.

Policies of Insurance.

Receipts for Money paid.

None of the Instruments above specified can, after they are made or signed, be stamped by the persons making or signing them.

Bills of Exchange and Promissory Notes drawn out of, but payable within, the Colony, must be stamped by the holder with an Adhesive Stamp or Stamps; but such Stamps must be affixed before presentation of such Bill for acceptance, and before indorsement, transfer, negotiation, or payment.

All other Instruments requiring to be stamped after execution must be stamped by the Commissioners; but the Commissioners are prohibited from so stamping any Bill of Exchange, Promissory Note, or other Note, Draft, or Order for the payment of money.

All Bills of Exchange, Promissory Notes, Drafts and Orders drawn within the Colony, must be written upon paper previously stamped by the Commissioners with an Impressed Stamp; except such Drafts or Orders as are liable to the duty of one penny only. These last, and no others, may be stamped with an Adhesive Stamp.

Impressed Stamps are obtainable at all Stamp Offices, and of all Postmasters acting as Official Distributors of Stamps.

**BYE-LAW OF THE COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF GREYMOUTH, MADE UNDER SECTION 186 OF "THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT, 1867." IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION 186 OF "THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT, 1867," THE COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF GREYMOUTH ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:—**

*First.* It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, on his or their premises, any offal, refuse, decayed substance, stagnant water, or any offensive matter or thing from which any stench shall arise, or from which any drainage, leakage, soakage, shall arise or take place, so as to be a cause of offence or nuisance to the occupiers or owners of the adjoining land, or to any other person.

*Second.* It shall be lawful for the Inspector of Nuisances, or any other officer of the said Council, on their behalf duly authorised, at all reasonable hours of the day, to enter into and upon the premises of any person or persons upon whose premises any such cause of offence or nuisance shall arise, lie, or exist, and to give notice in writing to the occupier, or, if there be none, then to the owner of such premises, to remove any such cause of offence, or otherwise to abate the same. And if such occupier or owner do not, within three days after the service of such notice, comply with the same, such occupier or owner on whom the said notice shall be served shall be liable to forfeit a sum not exceeding £5 (Five Pounds), to be recovered in a summary way before any Justice of the Peace, in the manner provided by "The Justices of the Peace Act, 1866." And it shall be lawful for any Resident Magistrate, or any two Justices of the Peace, to order such cause of offence to be removed, or such nuisance to be abated, by the said Inspector of Nuisances, or by the said Officer, and that the expense thereof shall be paid by such occupier or owner, as the case may be: Provided that in the event of there being no known resident occupier or owner resident within the Borough it shall be sufficient to post the said notice on the premises where the cause of offence or nuisance exists.

**BYE LAW No. 5.**

*At a Meeting of the Mining Drainage Board of the District of Jones's Flat, begun and holden at Ross, in the said District, on the 7th day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, it is enacted by the said Drainage Board as follows:—*

*That is to say—*

The Mining Drainage Board of the District of Jones's Flat, did expend the sum of ninety-five pounds, seventeen shillings, and five-pence halfpenny in preliminary expenses, for and on behalf of the said Drainage District; and for the purpose of equalising the said sum as aforesaid between the holders of the drainage area on Jones's Flat, and all such areas as may from time to time hereafter be applied for, to the Mining Drainage Board as aforesaid.

It shall be lawful for the said Mining Drainage Board to demand and receive a proportionate sum as may by the said Mining Drainage Board be determined on, in liquidation of such preliminary expenses as aforesaid, before any such drainage area—to any person or persons applying for the same—be granted.

**PROCLAMATION.**

**W**HEREAS, by the 13th clause of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to authorise the construction by private enterprise of any road, bridge, wharf, ferry, or other public work, for the use and benefit of the public, and to permit the occupation for a limited period of sites for the same, and to provide for the payment of such tolls for a limited period by all persons using the same as he shall deem reasonable:

And whereas, by the 109th section of the said Act, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time to delegate to such person as the

Governor may think fit all or any of the powers vested in the Governor by the said Act, except the powers conferred by sections twenty-two, forty, forty-eight, sixty, ninety-six, and one hundred and seven thereof, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit ;

And whereas, by an instrument in writing, dated the third day of February, 1869, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the eighth day of February, 1869, His Excellency the Governor did, under his hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, delegate unto me, Conrad Hoos, Chairman of the County Council of the County of Westland, all the powers vested in the Governor under or by virtue of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," except the powers conferred by sections eleven, twenty-two, thirty, thirty-three, thirty-nine, forty, forty-eight, sixty, ninety-six, and one hundred and seven of the said Act, to have, hold, and exercise the said powers hereby delegated to the said Conrad Hoos within the County of Westland :

Now, therefore, I, Conrad Hoos, Chairman of the County Council of the County of Westland, in exercise of the powers in that behalf delegated unto me, do hereby grant unto Aldrich, Boyle and Co., a further protection for the space of twelve months for their bridge erected across the Arahura River, and authorise the collection of the undermentioned tolls.

The protection to date from the twentieth day of December, 1869.
