PROCLAMATION.

G. F. BOWEN, Governor.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time to delegate to the Superintendent of any Province, or such other person as the Governor may deem fit, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the Act now in recital, except the powers conferred by sections twenty-two, forty, forty-eight, sixty, ninety-six, and one hundred and seven of the said Act, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit, and in like manner to alter or revoke any such powers: And whereas by "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1869," certain alterations in the said first recited Act were made, and certain additional powers were given to the Governor and to the Governor in Council, and it was by the said Act, now in recital enacted that the said "Gold Fields Act 1869," should be read and constructed in connection with and as part of the said "Gold Fields Act, 1866:" And whereas by "The County of Westland Act, 1868," it is enacted that in any Act of the General Assembly (except certain Acts, not including "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," the word "Province" shall include County of Westland, and the word "Superintendent" shall

include, with regard to such County, any person whom the Governor may from time to time appoint to perform within such County those duties, and exercise those powers, under any such Act which might, if such duties or powers had to be performed or exercised within a Province, be exercised or performed by the Superintendent of such Province:

Now, therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in exercise of the power and authority for this purpose in me vested, do hereby delegate unto

CONRAD HOOS, Esq.,

Chairman of the County Council of Westland, all the powers vested in the Governor and the Governor in Council under "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," and "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1869," except the powers conferred by sections twenty-two, forty, forty-eight, sixty, ninety-six, and one hundred and seven of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," to have, hold, and exercise within the said County the said powers hereby given to the said Conrad Hoos, so long as he shall continue and remain Chairman of the said County Council and no longer: Provided always that copies of all rules and regulations made under the said delegation shall be forthwith transmitted to the Colonial Secretary, in order that the same may be laid before the General Assembly, in accordance with the provisions of the one hundred and tenth clause of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866."

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at Auckland, this twenty-first day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

IT is hereby notified that his Excellency the Governor has assented to the Proclamations by the Chairman of the County Council of Westland under the Diseased Cattle Acts, dated respectively the 25th and 31st January, 1870, and published in *New Zealand Gazette*, No 8, of the 14th February, 1870.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of Canterbury intituled "The Gibson's Quay Ordinance Amendment Ordinance 1867" it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury to charge and recover Wharfage and Tonnage Rates on such articles landed upon the parcel of land known as Gibson's Quay and upon such vessels loading unloading or refitting at or beside such parcel of land or any wharf erected thereon at such rates as the Superintendent by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council shall from time to time determine :

And whereas by an Act of the General Assembly intituled "The Marine Act, 1867" it is provided that the Superintendent of every Province shall from time to time impose and levy rates dues and charges for the use of docks wharves piers and jetties and for the landing of goods wares and merchandise thereat and thereon :

And whereas by an Act of the General Assembly intituled the "County of Westland Act 1867" it is provided that all powers which at the time of the passing of the Act were vested in the Superintendent of the said Province either solely or with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Province shall within the said County become vested in the Governor provided that the Governor in Council may from time to time delegate all or any of the said powers to such person or persons as he may think fit :

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the third day of February, 1869 His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen Governor of New Zealand by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony did delegate to me, Conrad Hoos, within the County of Westland, all the powers heretofore of the Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury exercisable within the district comprised in the said County :

Now therefore I, the said Conrad Hoos by virtue of the powers delegated to me as aforesaid and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf do order and appoint that on and after the 1st day of April, 1870, the Wharfage and Tonnage Rates specified in the schedule hereunto annexed will be enforced on all goods landed upon the parcel known as Gibson's Quay aforesaid.

WHARFAGE DUES.

Bran, two shillings and sixpence per 60 bushels.
Bricks, five shillings per thousand.
Carrots, two shillings per 2,240 lbs.
Coals, one shilling per 2,240 lbs.
Chaff, four shillings per 2,240 lbs.
Cattle, five shillings per head.
Dairy produce, bacon, beef, &c., two shillings per 2,240 lbs.
Flour, two shillings per 2000 lbs.
Fruit (green), two and sixpence per ton measurement.
Grain, two shillings per 40 bushels.
Horses, five shillings each.
Lime, two shillings per 2,240 lbs.
Machinery, three shillings per 2,240 lbs.
Mangold Wurtzel, two shillings per 2,240 lbs.

Onions, two shillings and sixpence per 2,240 lbs.
 Potatoes, two shillings per 2,240 lbs.
 Poultry, one shilling per dozen.
 Palings, four shillings per thousand.
 Sawn timber, sixpence per 1000 superficial feet.
 Shingles, one shilling per 1000.
 Sheep, sixpence each.
 Pigs, one shilling each.
 Slates, three shillings per 1000.
 Turnips, two shillings per 2,240 lbs.
 Vehicles (two wheeled), five shillings each.
 Vehicles (four wheeled), ten shillings each.
 Velocipedes included.
 All other goods, two shillings and sixpence per ton.
 All packages and parcels threepence each.

TONNAGE DUES.

On all sailing vessels, foreign, intercolonial, or coastwise from ports beyond the limits comprised between Cape Farewell and Milford Sound, one shilling per ton freight, and all sailing vessels within the above limits, threepence per ton per trip.
 On all coasting steamers, including those coming from ports within the above boundaries, sixpence per ton per trip.
 On all inter-colonial steamers, when coming to the wharf, one shilling per ton per trip.
 On all lighters trading to the offing, or on all tug-boats bringing in cargo from vessels in the offing, one shilling per ton measurement, for all cargo carried to the wharf.
 On all tug-steamers, a charge of threepence per ton on the registered tonnage of all vessels towed in by them.
 A charge upon all steamers, bringing in or taking out passengers to and from the roadstead, at the rate of sixpence for each passenger.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, by the 13th clause of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to authorise the construction by private enterprise of any road, bridge, wharf, ferry, or other public work, for the use and benefit of the public, and to permit the occupation for a limited period of sites for the same, and to provide for the payment of such tolls for a limited period by all persons using the same as he shall deem reasonable :

And whereas, by the 109th section of the said Act, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time to delegate to such person as the Governor may think fit all or any of the powers vested in the Governor by the said Act, except the powers conferred by sections twenty-two, forty, forty-eight, sixty, ninety-six, and one hundred and seven thereof, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit:

And whereas, by an instrument in writing, dated the third day of February, 1869, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the eighth day of February, 1869, His Excellency the Governor did, under his hand and the

Public Seal of the Colony, delegate unto me, Conrad Hoos, Chairman of the County Council of the County of Westland, all the powers vested in the Governor under or by virtue of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," except the powers conferred by sections eleven, twenty-two, thirty, thirty-three, thirty-nine, forty, forty-eight, sixty, ninety-six, and one hundred and seven of the said Act, to have, hold, and exercise the said powers hereby delegated to the said Conrad Hoos within the County of Westland :

Now therefore, I, Conrad Hoos, Chairman of the County Council of the County of Westland, in exercise of the powers in that behalf delegated unto me, do hereby grant unto Hartley Stuttard and Co., protection for their line of tramway from Paroa to Marsden, and do hereby authorise the collection of the undermentioned tolls :—
