PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, by the twelfth section of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, upon application being made, to grant special claims of greater area than may be determined by the regulations to be made under the eleventh section of the said Act, for the purpose of carrying on mining operations under circumstances of extraordinary difficulty, or involving the expenditure of considerable sums of money, or for the encouragement of enterprise in prospecting new ground, or as a reward for the discovery of new gold workings, and also to prescribe the terms and conditions upon which any such special claim may be held, occupied, worked, and forfeited:

And whereas, by the one hundred and ninth section of the said Act, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the public seal of the Colony, from time to time, to delegate to such person as the Governor may think fit all or any of the powers vested in the Governor by the said Act, except the powers conferred by sections twenty-two, forty, forty-eight, sixty, ninety-six, and one hundred and seven thereof, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit:

And whereas, by an instrument in writing, dated the twenty-seventh day of January,

1871, and published in *The New Zealand Gazette* of the seventh day of March, 1871, His Excellency the Governor did, under his hand and the public seal of the Colony, delegate unto me, Henry Hermann Lahman, Chairman of the County Council of Westland, all the powers vested in the Governor under or by virtue of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," and "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1869," except the powers conferred by sections twenty-two, forty, forty-eight, sixty, ninety-six, and one hundred and seven of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," to have, hold, and exercise the said powers hereby delegated to me the said Henry Hermann Lahman, within the County of Westland:

Now therefore, I, Henry Hermann Lahman, Chairman of the County Council of Westland, in exercise and pursuance of all the powers vested in and delegated to me in this behalf, do hereby grant to Anderson and party a special claim of three roods thirty-eight perches, situated at the Stony Lead Grey District, subject to the conditions mentioned in the attached schedule.

Given under my hand at Hokitika, this fifth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy one.

SCHEDULE.

1. An annual rent of five pounds to be paid by Anderson and party.

2. Certificates of registration to be taken out by Anderson and party, and to be renewed annually at the Warden's office. All transfers of any interest in the claim to be registered at the Warden's office.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, the 9th day of August, 1871.

PRESENT:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, under the provisions contained in Part II. of "The Immigration and Public Works Act, 1870," it is provided that, for the purposes of the tenth and eleventh sections of the said Act, so far as they apply to the County of Westland, the term railways shall include such road-works, in the County of Westland as the Governor in Council may from time to time prescribe:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, under and by virtue of the authority conferred upon me by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, do hereby prescribe and declare that the road-works in the County of Westland, particularly mentioned in the schedule hereunder written, shall be road-works for the purposes of the hereinbefore-mentioned sections of the said Act; subject, however, to the provisions therein contained.

THE SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

A road from Greymouth inland by way of Omotumotu, Marsden, Nemona, Hohonu, Goldsbrough, Stafford Town, Hokitika, and Kanieri to Ross.

A road from a point on the above road about three miles east of Goldsbrough to join the main road to Christ-church at or about the seventeenth mile from Hokitika.

THE following Regulation, made under "The Diseased Cattle Acts," and published in "The County Gazette," No. 21, of the 25th June, 1870, is hereby re-published for general information.

All owners or persons having the custody, care, or possession of any cattle within the

said infected district shall, within fourteen days from the tenth day of July next, give a notice, in writing, to the Inspector of Cattle for the County of Westland, containing the number of such cattle, the particulars as nearly as can be of the place or places where such cattle are kept or are, the colour and brands separately of each beast; and if such owners or persons should lose any such cattle by death, such owner or person shall immediately give notice, in writing, to the Inspector of Cattle aforesaid, and such notice shall contain the colour and brand of each beast; and any person purchasing, or receiving into their custody, care, or possession, any cattle, shall immediately give notice, in writing, to the Inspector of Cattle aforesaid, stating the name of the person from whom purchased or obtained, and the description, colour, and brand of each beast separately; and if such owners or persons shall neglect or refuse to obey this Regulation, they shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten Pounds.
