PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, by the twelfth section of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, upon application being made, to grant special claims of greater area than may be determined by the Regulations to be made under the eleventh section of the said Act, for the purpose of carrying on mining operations under circumstances of extraordinary difficulty, or involving the expenditure of considerable sums of money, or for the encouragement of enterprise in prospecting new ground, or as a reward for the discovery of new gold workings, and also to prescribe the terms and conditions upon which any such special claim may be held, occupied, worked, and forfeited :

And whereas, by the one hundred and ninth section of the said Act, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council under his hand and the public seal of the Colony, from time to time, to delegate to such person as the Governor may think fit, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor by the said Act, except the powers conferred by sections twenty-two, forty, forty-eight, sixty, ninety-six, and one hundred and seven thereof, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit :

And whereas, by an instrument in writing,

dated the twenty-seventh day of January, 1871, and published in *The New Zealand Gazette* of the 7th day of March, 1871, His Excellency the Governor did, under his hand and the public seal of the Colony, delegate unto me, Henry Hermann Lahman, Chairman of the County Council of Westland, all the powers vested in the Governor under or by virtue of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," and "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1869," except the powers conferred by sections twenty-two, forty, forty-eight, sixty, ninety-six, and one hundred and seven of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," to have, hold, and exercise the said powers hereby delegated to me, the said Henry Hermann Lahman, within the County of Westland :

Now, therefore, I, Henry Hermann Lahman, Chairman of the County Council of Westland, in exercise and pursuance of all the powers vested in and delegated to me in this behalf, do hereby grant, subject to the following conditions, unto Morrice and Company, a special claim of six acres, situated at Callaghan's Gully, Waimea District, and containing six (6) acres more or less.

Bounded on the south-east by a line north-west of and two hundred and twenty-two (222) links from traverse peg No. 102 D P line ; on the north-west by a line bearing $54^{\circ} 45'$ Magnetic, distance one thousand five hundred (1500) links ; and on the north-

east and south-west by lines bearing $132^{\circ} 30'$ Magnetic, and four hundred (400) links in length.

Exclusive of reserves for races, residence areas, &c.

1. That within seven months from this date, twenty-six men be put on and kept constantly employed on the ground; Provided that in the event of any unforeseen obstacles arising whereby the ground cannot be worked, and of which the Warden shall be the judge, a further extension of time may be granted by him at his discretion.

2. That in the mean time the number of men to be employed be left to the discretion of the Warden.

And whereas, by an instrument in writing, dated the twenty-seventh day of January, 1871, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, of the seventh day of March, 1871, His Excellency the Governor did, under his hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, delegate unto me, Henry Hermann Lahman, Chairman of the County Council of Westland, all the powers vested in the Governor under or by virtue of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," except the powers

conferred by sections twenty-two, forty, forty-eight, sixty, ninety-six, and one hundred and seven of the said Act, to have, hold, and exercise the said powers hereby delegated to the said Henry Hermann Lahman, within the County of Westland :

Now therefore, I, Henry Hermann Lahman, Chairman of the County Council of the County of Westland, in exercise of the powers in that behalf delegated unto me, do hereby grant unto Martin Kennedy, protection for one year, from 21st of March, for his line of tramway from Paroa to Marsden, and do hereby authorise the collection of the under-mentioned tolls :—
