PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, by the twenty-ninth section of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, to demise for mining purposes, to any person, for any term not exceeding fifteen years from the making of the lease, any auriferous Crown Lands not exceeding ten acres in the whole of alluvial ground, or an area of 400 yards by 200 yards on a quartz reef, and to grant sites for machinery and any necessary easements for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless, to the conditions or provisions in the said section contained :

And whereas, by the one hundred and ninth section of the said Act, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time to delegate to such person as the Governor may think fit, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor by the said Act, except the powers conferred by sections twenty-two, forty, forty-eight, sixty, ninety-six, and one hundred and seven thereof, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit :

And whereas, His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zea-

land, did, on the twenty-seventh day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, delegate unto me, Henry Hermann Lahman, Chairman of the County Council of Westland, all the powers vested in him by the twenty-ninth section of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866:"

Now therefore, I, Henry Hermann Lahman, Chairman of the County Council of Westland, in exercise of the powers vested in me in that behalf, do hereby give notice that on the sixth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, intend to demise to the person named in the schedule hereto annexed certain auriferous Crown Lands containing quartz lodes or veins for the terms specified in the said schedule.

Block LXXIII. (Rural.)

GREY DISTRICT.

Situate between Lake Brunner and the Teremakau river. Bounded on the northward by Lake Brunner, on the eastward by a straight line bearing 180° (magnetic), through a point on the south bank of Lake Brunner one mile east of the mouth of the Orangipuku river, by the foot of the mountain range east

of the Paddocks, by Lake Poerua and by a straight line through the 33rd mile post on the Christchurch road bearing 360° (magnetic); on the southward by the Teremakau river; and on the westward by a straight line through the 30th mile post on the Christchurch road, bearing 360° (magnetic) by the foot of the Hohonu range, and by a straight line through a point on the south bank of Lake Brunner, one mile west of the mouth of the Orangipuku river, and bearing 180° (magnetic), exclusive of lands sold, necessary reserves, and subject to gold workings.

REGULATIONS OF THE COUNCIL OF THE
BOROUGH OF HOKITIKA MADE UNDER
SCHEDULE THIRTEEN IN PURSUANCE
OF SECTION ONE HUNDRED AND
NINETY-TWO OF THE "MUNICIPAL
CORPORATIONS ACT, 1867."

THE Council of the Borough of Hokitika make the following Regulations under the first subdivision of the tenth part of schedule thirteen, that is to say—

PASSENGER VEHICLES.

48. Every Hackney Carriage, Omnibus, Cabriolet, Cart, or Vehicles of any description plying for hire within the Borough of Hokitika, shall pay to the Borough fund for their License, and for the Registration of their names the sum of one pound (£1). All Licenses shall be made payable from the first day of June, 1872, and shall continue payable on each succeeding first day of June.

Passed by the Council of the Borough of Hokitika this twelfth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two.
