PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, by "The Bridges and Ferries Act, 1868, Amendment Act, 1869," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, at the time of making any Proclamation bringing "The Bridges and Ferries Act, 1868," into operation in any Province, or at any time thereafter, to delegate all or any of the powers by the said Act vested in the Governor and exercisable by him within the Province in such Proclamation mentioned, except the powers conferred by the second section of the said Act to the Superintendent of the Province, in which the said Act shall be so brought into operation, or to any other person or persons, and such delegation from time to time to alter and revoke:

And whereas, by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-sixth day of September, 1870, and published in "The New Zealand Gazette," No. 54, of the 30th September 1870, His Excellency the Governor has declared that the said "Bridges and Ferries Act, 1868," shall be in operation in the

Province of Westland on the twenty-sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy:

And whereas by "The Province of Westland Act, 1873," it is among other things enacted, that all the powers at the time of the first election of a Superintendent of the Province of Westland, vested in the Chairman of the County Council of the County of Westland, either solely or with the advice or on the recommendation of the County Council of the said County, except such powers as are contained in the parts of the Acts repealed by the said "Province of Westland Act, 1873," shall, within the Province of Westland, so far as applicable to the circumstances of the said Province, be vested in the Superintendent of the said Province:

Now therefore, I, James Alexander Bonar, Superintendent of the Province of Westland, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me do hereby proclaim that the ferry, mentioned in the schedule hereto annexed, shall be deemed to be a public ferry within the meaning of "The Bridges and

Ferries Act, 1868," and that the persons mentioned in the said schedule shall be and they are hereby authorised to collect the tolls therein set forth, for the terms and upon the conditions in such schedule mentioned.

Given under my hand at Hokitika, this thirteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation issued by His Excellency the Administrator of the Government dated the seventh day of May, 1873, and published in "The New Zealand Gazette," No. 30, of the 15th May, 1873, it was ordered that the purpose for which Reserve No. 451 (in red) was originally made should be changed, to the intent that the parcel of land described in the Schedule thereto should, under the provisions of "The Westland Waste Lands Act, 1870," be made a reserve for the purposes of a Public Cricket Ground, and that the residue of such original reserve should be sold as thereinafter mentioned: Provided that before such change should take effect, the Waste Lands Board of the Province of Westland should publish at least two calendar month's notice thereof in *The Province of Westland Gazette*.
