PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the tenth section of the "Protection to Animals Act, 1873," it is enacted that no native game shall be hunted, shot, taken, or killed in any part of the Province, except during such months as may from time to time be proclaimed by the Superintendent, not exceeding four consecutive months in respect of each bird mentioned in the Fifth Schedule of the said Act:

Now therefore, I, James Alexander Bonar, Superintendent of the Province of Westland, do hereby proclaim that April, May, June, and July, in each year, shall be the months in which native game, as described in the Fifth Schedule to the above

recited Act, shall be hunted, shot, taken, or killed, in any part of the Province of Westland.

Licensing Commissioners appointed.

JAMES FERGUSON, Governor.

WHEREAS by "The Licensing Act, 1873," it is provided that the Licensing Courts for the granting of Licenses under the said Act shall consist of the Resident Magistrate or Chairman of Petty Sessions, having jurisdiction within any district

proclaimed under clause three of the said Act, and any other persons to be nominated as Commissioners for the purpose by His Excellency the Governor:

Now, therefore, I, Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of the said Colony, do hereby nominate the persons named in the second column of the Schedule hereto attached to be the Licensing Commissioners within the districts in the first column of the said Schedule, placed opposite their names.

Sheriff's District of the County of Westland altered to "The District of Westland South."

JAMES FERGUSSON, Governor.

WHEREAS by "The Sheriffs Act, 1858," it is enacted that after the passing of the said Act it shall be lawful for the Governor, and for no other person, to appoint fit persons to be Sheriffs within the Colony, who shall hold their office during pleasure; and that it shall be lawful for the Governor, and for no other person, to define the districts within which the jurisdiction of the several Sheriffs shall be exercised, and the limits of such district from time to time to alter as occasion may require: And whereas by Warrant, bearing date the ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, the boundaries of the Sheriff's District of the County of Westland were defined: And whereas it is expedient that the name of the said district should be altered:

Now therefore, I, Sir James Fergusson Baronet, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of every power and authority in me vested in this behalf, do hereby declare that the said Sheriff's District of the County of Westland, as the same is defined as aforesaid, shall be and remain a district within which a Sheriff shall exercise jurisdiction, and shall be called by the name of "The District of Westland South."

As witness the hand of his Excellency the Governor, this eleventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four.

Delegation under "The Prisons Act, 1873," to Superintendent of Westland.

(L.S.) JAMES FERGUSSON, Governor.

WHEREAS by the fifty-first section of "The Prisons Act, 1873," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, under his hand and the Public Seal of the

Colony, from time to time delegate to the Superintendent of any Province the powers by the forty-seventh and fiftieth sections of the said Act vested in the Governor, to be exercised within such Province and not elsewhere, and may from time to time in like manner rescind any such delegation: Now therefore, I, Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance of the power and authority vested in me by the said in part recited Act, do hereby with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, delegate unto

JAMES ALEXANDER BONAR, Esq.,
as Superintendent of the Province of Westland, all the powers vested in me by the forty-seventh and fiftieth sections of the said Act, to be exercised within such Province and not elsewhere.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Right Honorable Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at Auckland, this second

day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four.
