PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, by the 13th Section of the "Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to authorise the construction by private enterprise of any road, bridge, wharf, ferry, or other public work, for the use and benefit of the public, and to permit the occupation for a limited period of sites for the same, and to provide for the payment of such tolls for a limited period by all persons using the same as he shall deem reasonable, and the Governor in Council may, from time to time, make, alter, and revoke regulations for collecting such tolls, and for preventing the evasion thereof, and generally for the control and management of the said roads, bridges, wharves, ferries, or other public works; and such regulations upon, and after being published in the Gazette of the Province to which they may apply, shall have the force of law; and whereas, by the one hundred

and ninth Section of the said Act, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time to delegate to such person as the Governor may think fit, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor by the said Act, except the powers conferred by Sections twenty-two, forty, forty-eight, sixty, ninety-six, and one hundred and seven thereof, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit; and whereas, by an instrument in writing, dated the 2nd day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and published in the New Zealand Gazette, No. 13, of the 26th February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, His Excellency the Governor did, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the Colony, delegate unto me, James Alexander Bonar, Superintendent of the Province of Westland, all the powers vested in the Governor under or by virtue of the "Gold

Fields Act, 1866," except the powers conferred by Sections twenty-two, forty, forty-eight, sixty, ninety-six, and one hundred and seven of the said Act, to have, hold, and exercise the said powers hereby delegated to me within the Province of Westland; and whereas, by a Proclamation dated the 11th day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and published in the Provincial Gazette, No. 24, of the 15th July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, I, James Alexander Bonar, Superintendent of the Province of Westland, in exercise of the powers vested in me, did grant to William Whitten protection for a Ferry over the Teremakau; and whereas it is expedient to revoke the same: Now, therefore, I, James Alexander Bonar, Superintendent of the Province of Westland, in exercise of the powers in that behalf vested in and delegated to me, do hereby revoke the aforesaid Proclamation, and do further proclaim and declare that I have appointed the undermentioned persons to be Toll Collectors at the Ferry set opposite their names on the terms as stated below, and subject to the conditions as published in the Provincial Gazette, No. 13, of the 29th April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and do hereby authorise the collection of the undermentioned tolls at the above-named Ferry.

Double the above charges may be made between the hours of ten o'clock p.m. and six o'clock a.m.

3. The Government to have the right to revise the scale of tolls yearly.

4. Persons and vehicles carrying Her Majesty's mails, and Government officers on duty, free.

5. Should the Government think fit to construct a bridge across the Teremakau during the term of protection, the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Pounds sterling to be paid to the Lessees by the Government, on the payment of which the punt and plant shall become the property of the Government.

6. The punt, gear, and approaches, to be maintained in good and serviceable condition, to the satisfaction of the Provincial Engineer, and a safe and serviceable boat to be attached to the punt at all times.

7. All timber within the limits of half a mile on either side of the punt, and within one chain from the river's edge to be left standing.

8. A light to be kept burning at each side of the ferry from sunset to sunrise.

9. The Lessees' house to be placed as near the river as possible, having due regard to safety from floods.

10. If the river is at any time fordable, the Lessees must give every assistance, if required to do so, in pointing out the fords to persons crossing, and in such cases the Lessees will be entitled to charge according to the above scale of tolls.

11. The Lessees to be at all times in attendance at the ferry in person; but should circumstances necessitate their temporary absence, competent persons to be provided to take charge of the ferry during such absence.

12. Seven days in each year to be allowed to the Lessees for necessary repairs to the punt, and before the punt is withdrawn for this purpose, permission in writing must be obtained from the Government, and proper and sufficient boats must be provided for keeping the ferry open for traffic during such repairs.

13. Protection may be cancelled should the ferry be neglected.

*Land reserved in Province of Westland for
Immigration purposes.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the sixty-first section of "The Immigration and Public Works Act Amendment Act, 1871," it is enacted that in any province in which there are not at any time, in the opinion of the Governor, waste lands of the Crown set apart or taken under the provisions of the said "Immigration and Public Works Act Amendment Act, 1871," or any other Act, for the purpose of furnishing means for defraying the costs of railways or other like purposes connected with railways, sufficient in quantity and suitable in quality and situation for settling immigrants, the Governor, on the recommendation of the Minister, may from time to time, by Proclamation published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, reserve and set apart any waste lands of the Crown within such province for the purposes of immigration, and to be dealt with under the said Act: And whereas there are not now, in the opinion of me, the Most Honorable the Marquis of Normanby, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, waste lands of the Crown in the Province of Westland set apart or taken under the provisions of the said Act, or any other Act, for the purpose of furnishing means for defraying the costs of railways, or other like purposes connected with railways, sufficient in quantity and suitable in quality and situation for settling immigrants:

Now therefore, I, the Most Honorable the Marquis of Normanby, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said section of the said Act, and all other powers enabling me in this behalf, and on the recommendation of the Minister for immigration do, by this Proclamation, reserve and set apart the land described in the Schedule hereto, being waste lands within the Province of Westland, for the purposes of immigration, and to be dealt with under the said Act.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that parcel of land in the Province of Westland comprising sixty thousand (60,000)

acres, more or less, and extending from the south side of Haast River to a point two miles south of the Arawata River; bounded on the West by the sea coast; on the East by a line four miles distant from and generally parallel with the coast; on the North by the Haast River; and on the South by the Smoothwater River.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House at Wellington, this ninth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington,
this third day of March, 1875.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-IN-
COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Supreme Court Act, 1860," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor-in-Council, from time to time, to divide the colony into judicial districts for the purposes of the said Act, and

the limits of such districts from time to time to alter as occasion may require, and that the Governor-in-Council shall assign every such district to a Judge or Judges of the Court, who shall have, within the same, all the powers and jurisdiction thereby given to the Court :

And whereas on the twelfth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, in exercise and pursuance of the powers conferred by the said recited provisions of the said Act, a district called "The Westland District" was formed and constituted by the Governor-in-Council :

And whereas on the second day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, in further exercise and pursuance of the said powers, the limits of the said Westland District were altered :

And whereas on the second day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, in exercise and pursuance of the said powers, the said Westland District was assigned to Christopher William Richmond, Esquire, a Judge of the Supreme Court ;

And whereas the said Christopher William Richmond, having obtained leave of absence, has left the said colony for a time :

And whereas it is expedient that the said Westland District should be assigned to Alexander James Johnston, Esquire, one of the Judges of the said Court :

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise and pursuance of all powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, assign the said Westland District unto

ALEXANDER JAMES JOHNSTON, Esquire, a Judge of the said Court.
